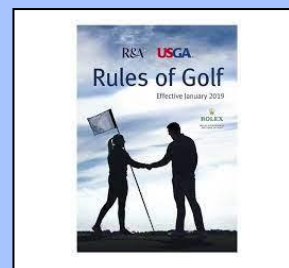

## RULES CORNER Oct 2024



Several players have asked about rules which have changed over the last few years. Thus, it may be time to review some that frequently arise during a round.

1. When searching for your ball if you accidentally move it there is no penalty. Just replace it on the original spot as best you can. (Rule 7)
2. On the putting green if you accidentally move your ball there is no penalty. Just put it back. (Rule 13)
3. A corollary to #2 says that if natural forces (eg. wind) moves your ball on the putting green you must:
  - a) Replace it on the original spot if it had already been lifted and marked
  - OR
  - b) Play from the new location if it had not been lifted and marked.
4. If your ball accidentally hits you, your caddie, a person attending the flagstick, or the removed flagstick there is no penalty. Play it as it lies. (Rules 11 and 13)
5. A player may repair almost any damage (including spike marks, damage caused at the hole by removing or replacing the flagstick and animal damage but not including natural imperfections) on the putting green. This may be done at any time, even if not yet on the putting green. (Rule 13)
6. A player may remove loose impediments and/or ground her club in a penalty area and there is no penalty. She may also remove loose impediment in a bunker, BUT may NOT touch the sand with her club to test the conditions or during a practice swing or in the backswing. Remember you may not remove a loose impediment if doing so causes the ball to move. (Rules 12 and 25)

## HOW DO I REGISTER FOR A SDCWGA EVENT?

### **Step 1: Register for a SDCWGA Membership**

Membership is open to any amateur member of a women's golf club with a handicap index and GHIN# provided by SCGA. Membership is free! To have access to all information and sign-up for events, golfers must be registered and sign in with a username and password.

You will need your SCGA GHIN# to register and create an account with a user name and password. **Go to: <http://www.sdcwga.net>:**

**If you don't have an account, select "Click Here To Register".** Set up your user name and password. Once membership registration is completed, you will be able to register and pay for SDCWGA events online.

### **Step 2: Register for a SDCWGA Event**

Email notifications for upcoming events are sent to all registered members, so it is important to update your email address in SDCWGA if it changes. The email notification will have a link to the event flyer and the event registration page. You need to log in with your user name and password to access event registration.

You can also register for events through the SDCWGA website: **Go to: <http://www.sdcwga.net> Click on Event Information Tab, then Event Schedule.**

- Scroll down in the event listing to the event you want to register for. If the event is open for registration, the box in the left column will be green and state "OPEN".
- On the event listing, right column, select "view". Then click on the "Register Now for this event" button on the left of the event flyer and provide all requested information, including payment.
- Note: A link to event results will be available on the right column of the event listing sometime after the event.
