J. David Richardson, MD, FACS

President, American College of Surgeons



Dr. J. David Richardson is a native Kentuckian who received his M.D. degree from the University of Kentucky and did his general surgery and thoracic surgery residencies at the University of Texas in San Antonio. He also received specialized training in surgical critical care and vascular surgery. He has been with the University of Louisville since 1976 and was Director of the Division of General Surgery for over 20 years. Currently, he is Chief of Surgery and Director of Emergency Surgical Services at University Hospital, and Vice Chair of the Department of Surgery.

Dr. Richardson has held several of the most important positions in American Surgery. He has served as President of the American Association for Surgery of Trauma, Southeastern Surgical Congress, Western Surgical Association and the Southern Surgical Association. He has also served as Chair of the American Board of Surgery and Vice Chair of the Residency Review Committee for Surgery. In 2012, he served as Chair of the Board of Regents of the American College of Surgeon. In October 2015, he was named President of the American College of Surgeons.

A prolific scholar, Dr. Richardson has contributed 357 peer-reviewed articles, 51 book chapters and two books to the surgical literature. He has delivered numerous named lectureships and over 90 visiting professorships. He received the University of Louisville Distinguished Faculty Award for Teaching, the School of Medicine Distinguished Educator Master Teacher Award, the Alumnus Association Red Apple Award for Excellence in Teaching at a University Level, and the Ephraim McDowell Kentucky Physician of the Year 2011. He has been honored as outstanding teaching faculty within the Department of Surgery on four occasions. In 2005, Dr. Richardson assumed the editorship of *THE AMERICAN SURGEON* journal in 2005.

Dr. Richardson has been active in the thoroughbred horse business most of his adult life. He has several horses in training as well as a commercial breeding operation. He served two terms as President of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association (1997-2000 and 2005-2007). He has chaired the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund. Currently, Dr. Richardson serves as Chair of the Board of Trustees of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders of America (he served on the board for many years). He also serves on the Breeder's Cup Board of Directors. Dr. Richardson is a member of the Jockey Club and has been recognized for his humanitarian work on the promotion of health and welfare initiatives on the backside of Kentucky racetracks.

Dr. L.D. Britt, a native of Suffolk, Virginia, was the valedictorian of Booker T. Washington High School. He received a B.A. degree (with *Distinction*) from the University of Virginia and was a member of the coveted Raven Society. A graduate of Harvard Medical School and Harvard School of Public Health, Dr. Britt has had extensive surgical and critical care training. He has been conferred honorary doctorates by two universities (Tuskegee University and Norfolk State University).

As the Henry Ford Professor and Edward J. Brickhouse Chairman of the Department of Surgery at Eastern Virginia Medical School, Dr. Britt is the first African-American in the country to have an endowed chair in surgery. Dr. Britt is the author of 224 peer-reviewed scientific publications and 52 chapters/non-peer-reviewed articles. He is the editor of three books, including a recent edition of the highly touted *Acute Care Surgery* (Lippincott, Williams & Wilkins, Medford, NJ). He serves on numerous editorial boards, including, the *Annals of Surgery*, *Journal of the American College of Surgeons* (Deputy Editor), the *American Journal of Surgery* (Associate Editor), *Archives of Surgery*, *Shock*, the *Journal of Trauma*, *Journal of Surgical Education* and others. In addition, he is a reviewer for the *New England Journal of Medicine*. He is a member of several national and international organizations. Dr. Britt has had many national and international leadership positions. Also, Dr. Britt is the past Chairman of the Board of Regents, and was elected President of both the American College of Surgeons and the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma in the same year.

Dr. Britt is the recipient of the nation's highest teaching award in medicine, the **Robert J. Glaser Distinguished Teaching Award**, which is given by the American Association of Medical Colleges in conjunction with the national medical honor society, **Alpha Omega Alpha**. In addition, on eight occasions, Eastern Virginia Medical School has awarded Dr. Britt the **Sir William Osler Award** as the outstanding teacher of the year. Dr. Britt received Virginia's most prestigious award, **The Outstanding Faculty Award**, which is presented by the Governor and State Council of Higher Education for excellence in teaching, research and public service. Additionally, Dr. Britt has been honored with an Emmy Award by the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences for his contribution to the television special: "Youth/Violence: A Call To Disarm."

President George W. Bush recognized Dr. Britt's leadership role in medicine and nominated him to the Board of Regents of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences, and he was subsequently confirmed by the United States Senate. At the end of his tenure, Dr. Britt was awarded the Distinguished Service Medal. He currently serves as a consultant and is the Distinguished Visiting Surgeon in Combat Trauma Care for the United States Department of Defense.
