



The variables for the formula speed = distance  $\div$  time can be rearranged, just like any other equation. This formula can be rearranged in three ways: speed = distance  $\div$  time (S=D/T) or this can be said as TIME = Distance / Speed

To calculate one of the variables (speed, distance or time) we need the other two, which we place into the formula and solve to determine the third variable.

Passenger 1 flew on the Cessna, Passenger 2 was on the Beaver and Passenger 3 was on the Otter.

They all left the Sioux Lookout to fly to Sachigo Lake at exactly 2:00 PM.

How much time had elapsed from the arrival of the first plane until the arrival of the third plane?


