HVAF (Helping Veterans and Families) and Veterans in Need

(Nov-Dec 2024)

The HVAF Manchester House is the Veteran house the Auxiliary adopted 13 years ago. As you have probably seen on the news, there was a major fire at that location October 26. The Manchester house was totally destroyed and 48 Veterans lost everything they have been struggling to regain. I spoke to my contact at HVAF and they believe the offices survived the fire but the apartments are a total loss. The Veterans that went to the hospital are ok and the 5 that were missing have been found and are ok. HVAF does not want collection donations at this time, as they do not have the facilities to store anything right now. They have set up an Amazon link for items needed immediately and specifically related to the fire. There is also a link for monetary donations. If you do not feel comfortable donating via the site, you can write a check to the Auxiliary, earmark it for HVAF, and we will use it to help them in any way we can. Below is the official news release they sent me showing the links.

Also, we will not be getting the names for the "Adopt a Veteran" tree until later in November. The tree will go up as soon as we get the names. May be late November or early December and we will try to let everyone know via email, Facebook and posting at the Legion. The timeline for gift return may be shortened. I know this isn't ideal for most of you but the HVAF time constraints have certainly changed and we need to help as best we can.

FROM HVAF:

On October 26, at around 9:30 P.M., there was a significant fire at HVAF of Indiana's Manchester Apartments — located at 960 Pennsylvania Street in downtown Indianapolis.

This facility serves as a transitional housing property for 48 homeless veterans. The damage was catastrophic, and we are unsure of the cause at this time. The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) and the Indianapolis Fire Department (IFD) are currently investigating the fire, please direct all fire-related questions to them.

We are thankful for IFD promptly arriving on the scene to work to put out the fire and for IndyGo for providing busses for providing transportation for displaced veterans.

All veterans have been relocated to local hotel rooms and we are coordinating with partners to provide appropriate support.
