Ratio of Adults to Children

Staff to Child Ratio: The number of children for whom each provider is responsible. A 1:3 ratio requires one adult to supervise no more than 3 children

When Child to Staff Ratio and Group Sizes are maintained...

- Caregivers can provide children with appropriate levels of supervision
- The health, safety, and overall development of children are optimised
- · Caregivers can attend to the unique needs of the child
- Caregivers can respond promptly and adequately in cases of emergency
- · Children feel safe, secure, and comfortable to explore their environment
- Ongoing safety and sanitation routines can be adequately followed





In addition to group sizes and ratios, the day care centre must also consider the following requirements:

- 25 sq.ft. per child of usable indoor space (i.e. not the kitchen, bathrooms, etc.)
- 50 sq. ft. per child of outdoor space
- One flush toilet and wash basin for every 15 children
- · One potty for each child being trained
- Class Ratios and group size are based on the youngest child.
