

CANNOT BE REMOVED AND/OR MOVED

Daily Meditation – Saturday January 3, 2026

The Bible says, “They that trust in the Lord shall be as mount Zion, which *cannot be removed*, but abideth for ever. As the mountains are round about Jerusalem, so the Lord is round about his people from henceforth even for ever” (Ps.125:1-2).¹ Regarding the mountains mentioned in this text: “To an Israelite, mountains were the symbol of all that was immovable and unchangeable. Mt. Zion is here named in particular because it was so intimately connected with divine purpose. To that rock-solid mount the pilgrims were making their way. No storms of trial could shake it. All around Jerusalem are higher hills. This girdle of mountains to the Psalmist was an ever-present symbol of Yahweh’s guardianship of his people.”²

Let us examine a Psalm that discusses God’s kingship. The Bible says, “The Lord reigneth, he is clothed with majesty; the Lord is clothed with strength, wherewith he hath girded himself: the world also is stablished, that it *cannot be moved*” (Ps. 93:1 KJV). That is a very powerful verse. Let us take a closer look at the word “majesty.” The more we understand to meaning of the words, in the verse, the more we will understand the meaning of the verse. “His majesty is associated with His greatness, power, glory, victory, and kingship over the heavens and the earth.”³

David prayed the following prayer to the assembly regarding God’s majesty. “So David blessed the Lord in the sight of all the assembly; and David said, ‘Blessed are You, O Lord God of Israel our father, forever and ever. Yours, O Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty, indeed everything that is in the heavens and the earth; Yours is the dominion, O Lord, and You exalt Yourself as head over all. Both riches and honor come from You, and You rule over all, and in Your hand is power and might; and it lies in Your hand to make great and to strengthen everyone” (1 Chron. 29:10-12).

The author of Hebrews wrote, “Wherefore we receiving a kingdom which *cannot be moved*, let us have grace, whereby we may serve God acceptably with reverence and godly fear: for our God is a consuming fire” (Heb. 12:28-29 KJV).
