

HOLINESS AS TO THE FATHER, SON, AND HOLY SPIRIT

Daily Meditation – Sunday August 16, 2026

The Bible says, “Who hath saved us, and called us with an holy calling, not according to our works, but according to his own purpose and grace, which was given us in Christ Jesus before the world began” (2 Tim. 1:9 KJV).

Let us survey the Word of God and study holiness.

Holiness regarding the Father: “For I am the Lord your God. Consecrate yourselves therefore, and be holy, for I am holy. And you shall not make yourselves unclean with any of the swarming things that swarm on the earth” (Lev. 11:44).¹

Holiness regarding the Son: “But you disowned the Holy and Righteous One and asked for a murderer to be granted to you” (Acts 3:14).

Holiness regarding the Holy Spirit: “Whoever speaks a word against the Son of Man, it shall be forgiven him; but whoever speaks against the Holy Spirit, it shall not be forgiven him, either in this age or in the age to come” (Matt. 12:32).

One important aspect of deity is that God is holy, entirely set apart from sin and sinners. The most common name for the Spirit is Holy Spirit, indicating the third person of the Trinity also possesses this transcendent attribute of deity.

Christians are also set apart. The life of a Christian is a process of being set apart from sin and set apart to Christ. The theological term for this Biblical truth is called sanctification.
