HIS HEART IS...

Daily Meditation - Saturday July 5, 2025

The Bible says, "He shall not be afraid of evil tidings: his heart is *fixed*, trusting in the Lord. His heart is *established*, he shall not be afraid, until he see his desire upon his enemies" (Ps. 112:7-8). Let's examine those two verses from different versions of the Bible. We will see the different terms that are used to describe the condition of the heart.

"He will not fear evil tidings; His heart is *steadfast*, trusting in the Lord. His heart is *upheld*, he will not fear, until he looks with satisfaction on his adversaries" (Ps. 112:7-8 NASB).

"He shall not be afraid of evil tidings; his heart is firmly *fixed*, trusting (leaning on and being confident) in the Lord. His heart is *established* and *steady*, he will not be afraid while he waits to see his desire established upon his adversaries" (Ps. 112:7-8 AMPC).

"They will have no fear of bad news; their hearts are *steadfast*, trusting in the Lord. their hearts are *secure*, they will have no fear; in the end they will look in triumph on their foes" (Ps. 112:7-8 NIV).

Let's meditate on the entire Psalm now. "Praise the Lord! How blessed is the man who fears the Lord, who greatly delights in His commandments. His descendants will be mighty on earth; the generation of the upright will be blessed. Wealth and riches are in his house, and his righteousness endures forever. Light arises in the darkness for the upright; he is gracious and compassionate and righteous. It is well with the man who is gracious and lends; he will maintain his cause in judgment. For he will never be shaken; the righteous will be remembered forever. He will not fear evil tidings; his heart is *steadfast*, trusting in the Lord. His heart is *upheld*, he will not fear, until he looks with satisfaction on his adversaries. He has given freely to the poor, his righteousness endures forever; his horn will be exalted in honor. The wicked will see it and be vexed, he will gnash his teeth and melt away; the desire of the wicked will perish" (Ps. 112:1-10 NASB). Can I give you a suggestion? Meditate on that Psalm every day for a week, morning and evening.

PRAYER FOR SALVATION – Father God, I repent of all my sins, and I believe you raised Jesus from the dead. I confess that Jesus Christ is the Lord of my life. Jesus, wash me with your holy blood. Holy Spirit fill me so I can be a mighty witness for King Jesus!
