

WISDOM AND REVELATION

Daily Meditation – Sunday June 14, 2026

The Apostle Paul, wrote, “For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience, and giving joyful thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of his holy people in the kingdom of light” (Col. 1:9-12).¹

In these last days, whoever has revelation knowledge will rule the earth. God’s people must rise-up and live and operate the way Jesus did, during His earthly ministry. Jesus came to show us the potential that we have inside of us. Jesus informed us, “Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father” (Jn. 14:12).

It is important to understand the following. “A mere knowledge of God’s Word is not what will please Him. We need to be controlled by that knowledge. The word fill means to control. To be filled with something (an emotion like fear or jealousy) means to be under its controlling influence that causes us to do things we might not do otherwise. Being controlled by God’s will should cause us to do things we might not otherwise do – things like enduring rather than giving up, like being patient with others rather than getting angry with them. The knowledge and control of God’s will come’s through all spiritual wisdom and understanding. This is more than simple intelligence. Wisdom refers to the comprehension of truth, while understanding refers to the application of truth. Being controlled by God’s will means believers comprehend the principles of Scripture and then put them into practice.”²

How is your prayer life these days? Do you have to increase your time meditating in God’s Word? Are you applying God’s truth to your daily life?
