We've been busy around the neighborhood!


Several volunteers stepped up to clean up

Baltimore County has an app called BaltCoGo that allows residents to report various issues to the County and track the progress easily. Search for the app in your phone's **App Store to request** county services (trash, plowing, etc.), report problems (trees, parking, abandoned vehicles, etc.). We've found this helps get a quick response and keeps all items organized in one place.
