

Ballet Etudes—named after the French term meaning "the study of ballet"—was born, becoming the first company of its kind in the area. 

SPECIAL INFORMATION **SECURITY FOR PARENTS OF PRE SCHOOL STUDENTS**

We are dedicated to providing the highest-quality preschool education in a secure, nurturing, and stimulating environment. Our age-appropriate curriculum and ongoing communication with parents address the physical, emotional, and intellectual needs of our preschool students.

During the first few weeks of classes, we focus on helping students become comfortable with the dance experience, their classroom, teacher, and classmates. Through age-appropriate music, stretching exercises, ballet basics, and creative games, we foster coordination, listening skills, musical awareness, and imagination. Remember, preschool dance is about helping children tap into their imaginations and express themselves creatively, rather than solely learning steps. So don't worry if your child doesn't pirouette around the house right away—it's all part of their dance journey.

The process of separating from parents is an important milestone for preschool children attending dance class. As children grow, they learn to develop an interest in class activities, feel comfortable with their peers, and understand that parents will always come back for them. We understand that some children may initially resist attending class, but it's usually short-lived. Here are some helpful suggestions:

- Focus on the positive aspects of the dance class experience.
- Keep goodbyes brief and avoid prolonged farewells.
- Seek assistance from the teacher during the separation process.

It's okay if dance class may not be the right fit for your child at this moment. If your child expresses distress or does not want to participate, please don't panic. Pushing children beyond their comfort zones may create negative associations with dance. We never want that. Never force your child into the classroom. If your child discontinues classes, we encourage you to try again next year, allowing your child to grow at their own pace.

UNDERSTANDING DANCE EDUCATION

As a parent, your support is invaluable to your child's dance journey. Encourage them to be the best version of themselves, focusing on their own accomplishments rather than comparing themselves to others. Dance is an individual art form, and each student progresses at their own pace. Our dedicated faculty not only teaches technique and steps but also imparts essential life lessons. Through dance, children learn commitment, teamwork, and the rewards of hard work. Our goal is to educate their minds, bodies, and souls, providing them with skills that will serve them well in all aspects of life.



Class Placement

Our experienced faculty carefully considers each student's progress and placement. Placement decisions are based on years of teaching expertise and aim to promote self-esteem and confidence. We understand that every child is unique, and factors influencing placement are complex. Trust in our faculty's judgment and encourage your child to embrace their class with enthusiasm, regardless of the level. Our priority is to provide a positive and empowering environment for each dancer.



Medical Information

Your child's well-being is of utmost importance to us. Please update your Parent Portal with any medical conditions, disabilities, or medications your child may require. Our teachers are professionals who are eager to work with all children, and the more we know about your child, the better we can provide a fulfilling dance experience. Rest assured that all information regarding our students is treated with the utmost confidentiality.



Do's and Don'ts

It's natural for parents and students to draw inspiration from others, but let's focus on personal growth rather than making negative comparisons. Encourage your child to celebrate their achievements and avoid speaking negatively about teachers, fellow students, or other parents. Our faculty takes their role as mentors seriously, guiding students to act respectfully towards their peers, adults, and themselves. If you have questions or concerns, please reach out directly to your child's teacher or the director. Misinformation can be avoided by seeking accurate information from the right sources.

UNDERSTANDING DANCE EDUCATION



Class Progression

Unlike academic settings where students move up a grade level each year, ballet training is a highly individual process. Each dancer develops at their own pace physically, mentally, and artistically. At Ballet Etudes, our faculty places students in the level that will best support their growth, strengthen their technique, and keep them safe from injury.

It's important to understand that not every dancer will advance to the next class level each year. In fact, it is common—and often necessary—for dancers to spend multiple years in the same level to build the strength, discipline, and precision that classical ballet demands. This is not a reflection of a dancer's worth or potential but rather a part of the natural progression of serious ballet training.



Pointe Shoes

Pointe is an exciting and important milestone for many dancers. Readiness for pointe is determined not by age or time spent dancing, but by a dancer's physical strength, alignment, technique, and consistency in class. Beginning in Ballet 3, faculty evaluates each dancer carefully to ensure that pointe work is introduced only when it is safe and appropriate.

A "pointe test" will be given to eligible students, and those who pass will be approved for pointe shoes. Beginning pointe too early can lead to serious injury, so we make these decisions with the utmost care and concern for each student's long-term development.

STAYING INFORMED



We strive to make the dance experience organized and enjoyable for everyone involved. To keep you well-informed, please read all newsletters and studio updates carefully. Newsletters and important updates will be emailed to you. If you have any questions, feel free to contact our office during business hours or send an email. Don't forget to follow us on Instagram for exciting updates!





Our dress code is designed to foster focus, inclusiveness, and equality among all dancers. By adhering to a uniform dress-wear, we create an environment where teachers can assess technique, alignment, and other crucial aspects of dance training effectively. Let's embrace the dress code with confidence and unity!

Dance shoes should never be worn outside to preserve their quality and cleanliness. Students with long hair are encouraged to secure their hair tightly and neatly away from their faces, preferably in a tidy bun. Maintaining good personal hygiene habits, including the use of deodorant for students aged 10 & older, is suggested for all dancers.

DRESS CODE REQUIREMENTS

Jewelry

During classes, we kindly request that students avoid wearing watches, large jewelry, and safety pins, as they can be distracting.

Ballet

Male: Black tights, dance pants, or shorts; white T-shirt; black ballet shoes. If you do not have ballet shoes, comfortable socks may be worn until ballet shoes can be purchased.

Female: Level-designated basic leotard (for current leotard dress code requirements, please visit balletetudes.net); pink tights, pink ballet shoes; hair must be secured in a bun; no skirts or warm-ups may be worn during class. If you do not have ballet shoes, comfortable socks may be worn until ballet shoes can be purchased.

Body Conditioning

Dance clothing that enables free movement; hair should be pulled back and out of the face. Bare feet or socks.

Tap

Dance clothing that enables free movement; hair should be pulled back and out of the face. Tap shoes are required.

Jazz

Dance clothing that enables free movement; hair should be pulled back and out of the face. Ballet or jazz shoes.

Modern and Contemporary

Dance clothing that enables free movement; hair should be pulled back and out of the face. Ballet, jazz shoes, or bare feet.

GENERAL POLICIES

At Ballet Etudes Academy, we strive to create a positive and focused environment for our dancers. Please familiarize yourself with our general policies below:

- **1. Respectful Class Atmosphere:** To ensure a productive learning environment, we kindly ask parents and students not to interrupt a class in session. Your cooperation helps us maintain a seamless experience for everyone.
- **2. Hydration and Nourishment:** Water is the only permissible beverage in our studios. We kindly request that you refrain from bringing food, drinks, or gum into the studios. Let's keep our dance spaces clean and enjoyable for all.
- **3. Safety and Supervision:** We cherish the opportunity to meet our students' siblings and appreciate your understanding that the safety of every child on our premises is our top priority. To ensure their well-being, please supervise children at all times.
- **4. Focused Learning:** During class time, we kindly request that all students refrain from using mobile phones, computers, or any electronic devices. Let's stay fully engaged in the dance instruction without distractions.
- **5. Communication Channels:** To streamline communication, we ask students and parents to direct all inquiries, messages, or concerns through the Ballet Etudes Academy email addresses provided on Page 4. Our dedicated team will be happy to assist you promptly and efficiently.
- **6. Promoting Positivity:** It is important that we create a supportive and encouraging atmosphere within our dance community. We kindly request that you refrain from speaking negatively about teachers, students, or parents.
- **7. Respect for Teachers:** Showing respect for our teachers is fundamental to maintaining a positive learning environment. Inappropriate behavior may result in dismissal from the school. Let's cultivate an atmosphere of mutual respect and appreciation.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

At Ballet Etudes Academy we believe in creating a positive, nurturing, and professional environment for all our students. We emphasize the importance of being part of a group, respecting others, our teachers and staff, and the studio property. Our goal is to foster good habits and cultivate a culture of compliance with rules of conduct. When a dancer exhibits unacceptable behavior or attitudes, we take a proactive approach. We kindly explain what went wrong and guide them towards a positive alternative approach or behavior.

Disruptive behavior is addressed in a respectful manner. If a dancer's behavior continues to disrupt the class, we kindly ask them to stop. Should the disruption persist, a reminder will be given, highlighting how it affects others. If necessary, the dancer's involved may be asked to take a short break (typically three to five minutes) before rejoining the class.

If a dancer's misbehavior persists and continues to significantly disrupt the class, we may need to involve the parent or guardian. We believe in open communication and will reach out to discuss the situation and request the dancer to be picked up if necessary. Please remember that our ultimate goal is to provide a safe and productive environment for all students.

ANTI-BULLYING, HARASSMENT & VICTIMIZATION

All students, including Company Members, Artistic Staff, Teachers, Board Members, and volunteers, must acknowledge and agree to this policy upon registration within the Parent Portal. Ballet Etudes is dedicated to maintaining a safe, inclusive, and respectful environment, free from bullying, harassment, and discrimination. The policy defines unacceptable behavior and explains how such concerns will be addressed. It applies to all individuals involved in Ballet Etudes activities, both on and off premises. While bullying and harassment will be formally addressed, other interpersonal issues between dancers or parents should first be resolved privately or with Artistic Staff support when needed.

TERMINATION OF ENROLLMENT

In certain rare circumstances, when it is in the best interest of one or more students, the school Director and/or Board of Directors may need to terminate a student's enrollment. We always strive to address and resolve any problematic situation before considering termination. Reasons for termination of enrollment may include disruptive or dangerous behavior by students or their parents, abuse of other children, staff, or property, etc.

We want every student to have a positive and fulfilling dance journey. Rest assured, termination of enrollment is a last resort, and we will make every effort to resolve any challenges that may arise. Let's work together to create an uplifting and joyful dance experience for everyone involved!

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

At Ballet Etudes Academy we value punctuality and safety for all our students. We kindly ask students to arrive 5-10 minutes before their class begins, allowing them to settle in and prepare for an amazing dance experience. To ensure the safety of our young dancers, children under the age of 10 should be picked up promptly after their class. Please understand that we are unable to assume responsibility for students before or after their scheduled classes, so it's essential for parents to ensure timely drop-off and pick-up.

We understand that unforeseen circumstances or emergencies may arise, causing delays. Our priority is to keep your child calm and safe until they can be collected. If any Ballet Etudes volunteers or staff must stay with your child after class or rehearsal ends, there will be a \$10.00 service fee after the first 10 minutes and a \$5.00 fee for every 5 minutes after that, the fee will be assessed and billed to the parent's account. Please call the studio to notify the office if you will be late due to an emergency.

ATTENDANCE

Every class at Ballet Etudes Academy is a step forward in the educational journey of our students. Regular attendance is essential for continuous progress and growth. From January through May, choreography for the year-end Showcase will be taught and rehearsed. It's crucial for children to feel completely confident with the choreography and their performance. Missing classes during this period could lead to frustration for the students, their teachers, and their classmates. We encourage all students to prioritize their dance education and make attending classes a top priority.

TARDINESS

Dance is a physical activity that requires a properly warmed-up body to ensure safe movement execution. Students who arrive late miss out on the essential warm-up and/or barre exercises, which may increase the risk of injury. To prioritize the safety and well-being of our students, those arriving more than 10 minutes late may be asked to observe the class. We want all our dancers to enjoy their dance journey while staying safe and injury-free.

CLASS VISITORS:

For the safety of our students and to fulfill our responsibilities, we are unable to permit visitors in the classroom during regular class sessions. Students should refrain from inviting siblings, relatives, or friends to their classes.

MAKEUP CLASSES:

We understand that unforeseen circumstances may cause a student to miss a class. To ensure they don't miss out on the valuable learning experience, we offer the opportunity to make up the missed class with a similar one by scheduling makeup classes in your Parent Portal.

LOST AND FOUND:

We know how easy it is for dance-wear, shoes, and personal items to get misplaced. To avoid any confusion, please make sure to label all your child's belongings with their name. We will make every effort to locate and return lost items; however, we kindly ask for your understanding that we cannot be held responsible for any items your child brings to class.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION:

We prioritize preparedness and the safety of our students and staff. In the event of an emergency, students will calmly and quietly evacuate to the designated area. Our dedicated teachers will take attendance to ensure everyone's safety. Students and teachers will return to the building only when the all-clear signal is given, indicating that it is safe to do so.

ILLNESS:

The health and well-being of our students and staff are of the utmost importance to us. We kindly request your cooperation in keeping our dance community healthy. If your child exhibits any of the following symptoms, we kindly ask that you keep them at home to prevent the spread of illness:

- Nasal discharge that is green or yellow
- Complaints of ear pain
- Consistent cough
- Severe sore throat
- Pink, burning, itching, or discharging eyes
- Diarrhea or vomiting
- Fever

If these symptoms or any other contagious conditions are observed in your child during a class, we will promptly contact you to arrange for their immediate pick-up. When your child has a fever, please keep them at home until their temperature returns to normal. Furthermore, if there are any lingering signs of illness such as glassy or watery eyes, listlessness, or drowsiness, we kindly request that you keep your child at home. This precaution will ensure that the illness has fully passed, and your child will be well enough to fully participate in class activities the following week.

PARKING LOT SAFETY:

The safety of our dance family is our top priority. When entering and exiting our parking lot, we kindly ask everyone to exercise extreme caution. Please be mindful of the presence of children of all ages. It is essential to park only in designated parking spaces and avoid parking in areas that are not intended for vehicles. Additionally, we kindly request that you refrain from idling your car if parked in close proximity to the building. For the safety of all, we kindly ask that siblings do not play in the parking lot. Let's create a safe and secure environment for everyone to enjoy.

SHOWCASE ::::


