1.) I SEE YOU'RE FROM MISSISSIPPI, HOW WAS IT GROWING UP IN THERE?

Actually I had wanted to be an actress since I was little. I used to act out skits and scenes I came up with from my wild imagination. Then I figured I'd never get into acting because of my location but in Tennessee 2007, I met Donald Farmer and he got my career started with Chainsaw Cheerleaders. I'm so thankful for him and absolutely love working with him.

4.) WHEN DID YOU START SHOWING INTEREST IN ACTING?

About age 5. I wanted to be on a screen & be someone who was going on adventures.
My favorite show back then was The Worst Witch & I would act like I was a character from that show.

I even took my mom's broom outside, with my cat and a big purse, out to our swingset and acted like I was flying like they did in The Worst Witch lol I knew then what I wanted to do in life.

5.) WHAT IS YOUR FAVORITE SONG THAT YOU HAVE WRITTEN AND PLAYED?

My favorite would have to be SweetTart.

6.) OUT OF ALL THE MOVIES THAT YOU HAVE DONE, WHICH ONE DID YOU HAVE THE MOST FUN ON SET?

I will say the most fun set was a tossup of Darbie's Scream House, Hollywood Werewolf, my scenes in Mocos.

7.) YOU HAVE BEEN WITH YOUR BAND SINCE 2000 IN COLLEGE, AS FAR AS TRANSITIONING & PASSION, WHAT WOULD YOU SAY THE ELEVATION WAS LIKE FROM THEN TO NOW?

It was soooo much fun! I was nervous at first so that was a bit challenging but the director, Donald, was so easy to work with.



- I'm from Yonkers, New York.
- 2:) WHEN DID YOU START HAVING MANY INTERESTS IN SONG WRITING?
- I began songwriting at the age of 13.

The first song I ever wrote was about stylish socks, which eventually evolved into writing about my personal life experiences as an adult.

3.) I LIKE THE NAME.

HOW DID YOU COME UP WITH IT?

I discovered the name Lord Talent in my 20s while preparing to audition for America's Got Talent. In one of the songs I wrote, I included the line, "I am Talent," and at that moment, I knew what my stage name would be. Later, I added the title "Lord" to reflect the mastery I aspired to achieve in my craft.

4.) WHEN DID YOU LEARN HOW

TO PLAY INSTRUMENTS?

The first instrument I learned to play was the trombone at age 12. In my early teens, I picked up the trumpet, piano, snare, and bass drums. As an adult, I taught myself to play the guitar, recorder, and violin and I also taught myself how to sing.

5.) WHAT MADE YOU WANT TO BECOME A MULTI-INSTRUMENTALIST?

I never imagined I'd become a multiinstrumentalist. My musical journey started with the trombone in school, but I developed a deeper interest in piano and guitar when I began producing beats for my own music. 6.) OUT OF ALL THE HIP-HOP ARTISTS.
WHICH WAS MOST INFLUENTIAL TO YOU?

The two most influential artists in my life are Aubrey Drake Graham and Dwayne Carter.

7.) OUT OF ALL OF YOUR SONGS WHICH IS
THE MOST IMPACTFUL SO FAR & WHY?
Out of all the songs I've written, my
most impactful is Oh Sapphire, a
heartfelt tribute to my daughter.
I wrote it to ensure that her spirit
would live on through my music.

8.) I SEE YOU HAVE GREAT TASTE IN FASHION, WHAT DO YOU LIKE THE MOST ABOUT FASHION?

I also have a passion for fashion it allows me to express myself artistically in a variety of ways.

9,) WHO ARE YOUR FAVORITE FASHION DESIGNERS OR FASHION BRANDS?

I don't have any favorite designers or brands. My mom always said I was never drawn to name brands like Nike or Jordan.

Instead, I gravitated toward unique pieces, often from lesser known labels, simply because they resonated with me.

To all the younger viewers: chase what you're passionate about and pursue it with intention. Find your purpose and live it fully. Embrace this experience we call life. 






GREETINGS:

WHAT'S UPI SO, FOR STARTERS, I JUST WANNA THANK YOU SO MUCH, MANDY, FOR HAVING ME. FOR THOSE WHO DON'T KNOW ME MY NAME IS WHOA ZAYY, I AM 21 YEAR'S OLD AND I AM FROM WASHINGTON DC.

1.) HOW LONG HAVE YOU LIVED IN D.C?

I lived in DC from when I was about three to, I wanna say, maybe 13 or 14, until I moved to Maryland. Growing up in DC was pretty hard considering my childhood. I didn't really have much of that. You know, it wasn't really any going outside to play, It wasn't really any hanging out with friends or sleepovers. I didn't do any of that. My parents were real restrictive when it came to those types of things. They just really wanted to protect me.

2.) WHEN DID YOU START SINGING?

I started making music when I was about 14.

I am a writer. I write songs, plays and poems. I primarily write my own song lyrics. I also work with a team, Grady McCain of WIAW RECORDS and Bruce Gardner who are also writers and we submit lyrics and songs to each other for consideration.

4.) WHO INSPIRED YOU TO WRITE MUSIC?

So, what inspired me to write music? It was actually a movie. I watched sparkle and just looking at how they came up from one of their sisters just writing songs to them performing at big stages, going on tour, you know, with these famous people, going to Motown like I wanted that ever since I've seen that movie. I just started writing my own music and my own songs and in my head I was sparkle.

5.) WHO INSPIRED YOU TO SING?

So, honestly, I'm not really much of a singer. Like, I like to vocalize, I like to sing, but like I'm definitely more of a rapper. I would say who inspiring me to sing was like honestly like rappers in the industry like Nicki Minaj, Doja Cat, Lil Nas X, Drake like all these rappers that vocalize, all these rappers that sing that's really who inspire me because if they can do it then I can do it. even Megan Thee Stallion she sings like if they can do it I can do it. Who inspired me to rap again people I see in the public eye you know my favorites, Nicki, J. Cole, you know, etc., but who inspired me to do it myself is actually one of my really good friends. He really inspired me to rap because I would watch him. You know right raps in school and everything and he really just made me want to do it myself.

all right, so the first song that I've ever performed in front of a crowd, like ever, was this song called "Wicked" it was one of my really really early songs.

Honestly, I wanna collaborate with everybody but if I'm looking to see what makes the most sense with my music, I would say like Doja Cat, Tyler, The Creator, Lil Nas X, Doechii like, I feel like that's my realm right there.

I would say the message behind my music is just to follow your dreams and always go to the next level like you never wanna go backwards. You always wanna go forward. 
10.) WHAT ADVICE WOULD YOU GIVE TO THE YOUNGER VIEWERS WATCHING?

1.) WHERE ARE YOU FROM?

I am originally from Louisville, Kentucky, but now live in the State of California.

- 2.) CAN YOU REMEMBER THE FIRST GOSPEL SONG THAT YOU CAN REMEMBER SINGING AS A CHILD? I wrote my gospel song at the age of 11, singing it.
- 3.) HOW WAS YOUR CHILDHOOD?

 My childhood had its ups and downs.

 I have always, from what I can
 remember, had a passion and love for
 Christ, to know him and to learn of him.
- 4.) AT WHAT AGE DID YOU START SHOWING SIGNS THAT YOU WERE INTERESTED IN SINGING?
 In the 90s, at 23, I pursued a music career professionally.
- 5.) AT WHAT AGE DID YOU START SONGWRITING?

I started writing songs at 11 years old.

6.) HOW WAS IT FOR YOU TO HAVE BEEN APART FROM THE GRAMMYS PRE-PARTY IN LA, PERFORMING AT THE SAME VENUE WITH ACTS SUCH AS THE WHISPERS, H-TOWN, TEENA MARIE, JAMES BROWN, ERIC BENET, AND MANY MORE.

It was like a vision come true! I've always had a passion for performing and meeting the great artists I grew up listening to. It was a blessing and a wonderful opportunity for me.

7.) HOW DID YOU FEEL WHEN YOU GOT SIGNED BY PITTMOBILE RECORDS IN 1998, DISTRIBUTED BY ICHIBAN RECORDS? I felt great! It was work because I had to still learn the business back then, working to promote my album and networking, but it was great to do so.

8.) AND THEN YOU WOULD GO ON TO GET OVER 80 BDS ON THE AIRPLAY WITH "SHE WAS NEVER HER" WRITTEN BY FRED PITTMAN AND PRESTON GLASS...CAN YOU DESCRIBE THAT FEELING?

I remember I would go to the outside market where they would sell newspaper and magazines. I would look up in the back of those newspaper where they would report the R and R report for added radio, and see my song She Was Never Her, added to many radio stations. I was super excited.

9.) HELLO LOVE WITH MUSIC BY MICHAEL POWEL...
CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT THIS ALBUM & WHERE
WERE YOU MENTALLY WHEN IT WAS MADE?
Introducing Angel was my first album. Fred
Pittman had a lot of connections in the music
industry. Michael Powel was one of them. We
travel to Detroit to record the song, Hello Love,
a duet with me and L.J. Reynolds, Lead singer
of the Dramatics. L.J. told me he loved my voice
and together, we recorded at Michael's studio.
I saw a plaque with Aaliyah on the wall.
Michael Powell had worked on one of the songs
of her on the One In A Million album.

10.) NOW IT'S 1999. YOU ARE RISING QUICKLY TO THE TOP AND YOU COME OUT WITH YOUR SECOND ALBUM NAMED "LOVE RIDE"...CAN YOU TELL US MORE ABOUT YOUR EXPERIENCE WHILE MAKING THIS ALBUM?

Ichiban had folded while we were getting ready to release the second song I wrote, "You Missed A Good Thing". We used Inchbain studio in Atlanta and recorded more songs for my new album to shop for my next record deal, and started looking after the album was completed. I named it Love Ride because it was so smooth and romantic. I had some great writers and producers on this album. I wrote 5 songs on that album. Larry Baptise, Preston Glass, so many other great award-winning songwriters were on the Love Ride album.

11.) 1999 WAS A VERY SPECIAL YEAR FOR YOU.

CAN YOU TELL US ABOUT THE GROWTH?

I never stopped writing and recording songs.
I continued as a businesswoman, starting my own label with two other founding partners,
Demetrius Guidry and Rodney Crews, called
Atlas Elite Entertainment. I manage two artists: my daughter, Princess of AEE, R&B recording artist, and my other artist, Hip-Hop recording artist, we call the Prince of AEE, Big
Wae. I do the Branding, PR Relations,
Advertising, and work with major companies within my business. I became a 16x award-winning recording artist, Grammy Voting
Member, and NAACP Award Member.

12.) HOW DID YOU FEEL HAVING
THE OPPORTUNITY TO WORK WITH
PHIL/JONES ON A NEW PROJECT THAT
MOVED YOU INTO ACTOR/DIRECTOR,
WITH FRED WILLIAMSON PLAYING
ANGEL'S FATHER IN THE VIDEO?

Fred Williamson is a wonderful person.

We met in 1999 when I first did my short film called Sugar Race. He then played my father in my video Get It Right from my album, Love Ride. He said to me that he was working on a film and he would love me to be in it to sing. I thought it was Hollywood talk, lol, but he really meant it! The very next year, he was shooting his film called, 'Down N Dirty" and I played myself in that film. You can still watch that film now. It was also on Showtime, HBO, Cinemax, and in the movies. The SoundTrack to the film is on Amazon, and I have lots of songs and credit on that soundtrack.


