<u>Context.</u> Covid-19 raised much greater attention to the role that essential workers – particularly in helping, caregiving, and education roles – play in society and the need to value and support them. These include doctors and nurses and classroom teachers – but they also include frontline direct care and community health workers and child care workers and educators.

These workers are vital to lowa's well-being in social terms and as a workforce behind the workforce. They also are a part of the workforce and economy and in the highest demand for new workers.

When well-resourced and supported, these workers can build careers that enable them to raise their own families and contribute to the economy. This workforce, however, relies upon government to provide much of its financing, as part of society's human infrastructure. Currently, despite the essential nature of the work these direct care and child care workers do, they are under-resourced and among the lowest paid of workers in society.

The Iowa Helping Community Policy Group advocates for increased policy attention to and commensurate public (state and federal) investments to support this workforce. We are asking all candidates for state office to respond to the following questions.
