

CREATING A COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL COUNSELING PROGRAM

SUGGESTED IMPLEMENTATION STEPS

DESCRIPTION

This document is to help schools and districts implement a comprehensive school counseling program aligned with the ASCA National Model. This is meant to be a step-by-step process, as outlined below.

Note: If you have some components in place already, please adapt the steps as needed for your situation.

STEP 1

SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES

- Begin drafting <u>weekly calendar</u> (one per school counselor)

 - I recommend this activity be done by allowing school counselors to work with the other school counselors at their level. This will allow for collaboration between schools.

• Annual Administrative Conference

SUGGESTED ACTIVITY

- Complete the <u>Annual Administrative</u> <u>Conference</u> by the end of September
 - I recommend this meeting be done by all school counselors at the start of every year. Even if you have to leave some of the parts blank on the form, starting this conversation is vital. Ideally, after the school counselors have this meeting, they have time to process and share their successes and areas for growth for next year's meeting.
