TOILET TRAINING AGREEMENT

To ensure consistency and collaboration between home and daycare during the toilet training process, Little Nuggets Daycare has developed this Toilet Training Agreement. By working together, we can make this important milestone as smooth as possible for your child.

Expectations for Toilet Training

Toilet training is a shared responsibility between Little Nuggets Daycare and parent(s)/legal guardian(s). For toilet training to be effective, we ask that you follow the same approach at home to maintain consistency. By signing this agreement, both the provider and parent(s)/legal guardian(s) agree to the following terms regarding the toilet training.

Parent(s)/Legal Guardian(s) Responsibilities:

- 1. Initiating the Process:** Toilet training will begin at home. Your child should show readiness by expressing interest in using the toilet, staying dry for longer periods, or verbally communicating their need to go.
- 2. Communication:** Parent(s)/legal guardian(s) will communicate with Little Nuggets Daycare when they believe their child is ready to begin toilet training. You will inform the provider of any specific words or phrases used at home to indicate the need to use the toilet.
- 3. Supplies:** Parent(s)/legal guardian(s) are responsible for providing adequate supplies such as extra clothing, underwear, and pull-ups/diapers during the toilet training period. If accidents happen, a sufficient amount of spare clothes must always be available at the childcare facility.
- 4. Consistent Approach:** Parent(s)/legal guardian(s) will follow a consistent approach to toilet training at home, aligned with the methods used at Little Nuggets Daycare. This includes taking the child to the toilet at regular intervals, using positive reinforcement, and avoiding punitive actions in case of accidents.
- 5. Informing the Provider of Progress:** Parent(s)/legal guardian(s) will update the provider regularly on the child's progress, particularly on successes, challenges, or changes to the toilet training routine at home.

Little Nuggets Daycare Responsibilities:

- 1. Support During the Day:** Little Nuggets Daycare will provide gentle reminders to the child to use the toilet at regular intervals, typically every 1-2 hours or when the child shows signs of needing to go.
- 2. Positive Reinforcement:** We will use positive reinforcement such as praise and encouragement when the child successfully uses the toilet. Under no circumstances will we use shaming, punishment, or negative language if accidents occur.
- 3. Toilet Training at the Child's Pace:** The provider will work with the child at their pace. No child will be forced to use the toilet if they are not ready or show resistance. We will also avoid pressuring the child if they seem anxious or stressed about the process.
- 4. Handling Accidents:** Accidents are a normal part of toilet training. Little Nuggets Daycare will handle accidents calmly and professionally, assisting the child with changing their clothes and cleaning up any messes. Parents will be informed of any accidents that occur during the day.
- 5. Documentation:** The provider will regularly communicate with the parent(s)/legal guardian(s) about the child's progress, providing feedback about successes or difficulties encountered during daycare hours.

By signing this agreement, both Little Nuggets Daycare and the parent(s)/legal guardian(s) agree to cooperate fully in the toilet training process, following the guidelines and expectations outlined above.
