<u>Taco Chili</u>

2 # ground beef 1 can (15 oz) black beans 1 can (16 oz) kidney beans 1 can (15 oz) pinto beans 1 can (14 oz) hominy 1 can (10 oz) diced tomatoes & green chiles, Undrained 1 can (8oz) tomato sauce 1 small onion, chopped 1 envelope ranch salad dressing mix 1 envelope taco seasoning 1/2 t pepper 1 can chopped green chiles 2 cans(14oz each) diced tomatoes, un-drained Optional toppings: corn chips, sour cream, shredded cheddar cheese... Brown ground beef til no longer pink, 8-10 min. using slotted spoon, transfer beef to a 5 qt. slow cooker

Rinse & drain beans & hominy, add to

cooker along with canned tomatoes & green chiles, tomato sauce, onion, dressing mix, seasoning mix & pepper. Puree the green chilies & remaining diced tomatoes in a covered blender until smooth, stir into the crockpot mixture.

- Cook, covered, on low for 6-8 hours. Serve with toppings if desired.
 - Taco chili is freeze-able. To use; thaw partially in fridge overnight and then re-heat on stove, adding a little water if necessary.

Veggie Corn Muffins

1 cup yellow cornmeal 1/2 cup all-purpose flour 1/2 cup whole wheat flour 1 t baking powder 1/4 t salt 1 large egg, room temperature 1 cup unsweetened almond milk 1/4 cup canola oil 1/4 cup honey 1/2 cup finely shredded carrot 1/2 cup finely chopped green pepper Preheat oven to 400* Coat 12 muffin cups with cooking spray Whisk together the cornmeal, flours, baking powder,& salt. In another bowl, whisk together the egg, milk, oil & honey. Add to cornmeal mixturestir just until moistened. Fold in in the vegetables. Fill prepared cups 2/3 full. Bake until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean cook 12-15 min. cool in pan 5 min, then remove to a wire rack to cool. Serve warm. Muffins are freeze-able. To use; microwave on high up to 45 sec.
