

This is why scripture reminds us to cast thy burden upon the Lord, and he shall sustain thee (Psalm 55:22).

The Recipe Box

Hi Everyone, It's a beautiful day in the LCI. We are so fortunate to live here. Everything is busy around us but soon school will start down below and our summer people will fade out as softly as they faded in....

I have 4 favorite recipes of **Pastor Jim and Terri Huber.** I decided to put them all in this month. It'll make my job easier because I think they'll fit the space and I won't have to dream up any others, so thanks **Terri and Jim**, here we go...

This is one of **Jim's** favorite cold pasta salads. I usually add more of the ingredients to taste. (T.H.)

Tuna Macaroni Salad

16 oz elbow macaroni (or small pasta of your choice), cooked to al dente & cooled 2 teaspoons celery seeds Sliced green onions to taste 3 cans tuna in water, well-drained 1 cup mayonnaise (I use Miracle Whip instead) Kosher salt & ground black pepper to taste

Combine all ingredients well. Serve immediately or refrigerate until you're ready to serve for up to a week.

Huber Family's Favorite Meatloaf (slow cooker recipe)

2 eggs, beaten 1/2 t ground sage ½ cup milk

2/3 cup dry breadcrumbs

1-1/2 pounds lean ground beef

2 cups grated onions

1/4 cup catsup

2 T brown sugar (I use dark)

1/2 T salt

1/4 cup favorite BBQ sauce (I blend two)

1/4 cup catsup

2 T brown sugar (I use dark)

1 t dry mustard

1/4 t grated nutmeg

In large bowl, combine eggs, milk, breadcrumbs, grated onion, salt, sage & meat. Mix well & shape

into 9"x 5" rectangle. Place in crock. Cover & cook on LOW for 5-6 hours. Combine catsup, BBQ sauce, brown sugar, dry mustard & nutmeg in small bowl (I use a measuring cup); pour over meat. Cover & cook 15 more minutes on HIGH.

Not Yo' Mama's Banana Pudding (Paula Deen recipe)

This one has been a big hit at our church potlucks. I use it at Christmastime, substituting the Christmas version of the Chessmen cookies.

1 (14 oz) can sweetened condensed milk 1 (12 oz) container of Cool Whip, thawed OR equal amount sweetened whipped cream 2 bags Pepperidge Farm Chessmen cookies 6-8 bananas, sliced

2 cups milk

1 (5 oz) box instant French vanilla pudding

1 (8 oz) package cream cheese, softened

Line the bottom of a 13"x 9"x 2" dish with one bag of cookies and layer bananas on the top.

In a bowl, combine the milk & pudding mix. Blend well, using a handheld electric mixer.

Using another bowl, combine the cream cheese and condensed milk together and mix until smooth. Fold the whipped topping into the cream cheese mixture. Add the cream cheese mixture to the pudding mixture and stir until well blended. Pour the mixture over the cookies and bananas. Cover with the remaining cookies. Refrigerate until ready to serve.

To Your Health...

Life Saving Gifts

Have you considered how many lives may be impacted through someone's decision to donate their organs, eyes or tissueBenefits of organ donation are numerous. They can not only add years of life while also improving their quality of life. Donated tissue such as tendons, skin and bones can restore mobility and hope for combat veterans, burn victims and those with damaged joints.

Everyone is a potential donor, no matter your age or medical condition. All organs, eyes or be suitable may not transplantation, but even one organ, eye or tissue gift can greatly affect an individual. The national United Network for Organ Sharing will make the decision on who receives your organs, eye or tissue depending on their medical information and tissue type matching.

There are nearly 107,000 people nationally who are on the national waiting list. Many die each day waiting for an available organ. Once you decide you want to be an organ donor you will need to register with the Michigan Organ Donor registry at giftoflifemichigan.org . Be sure to talk to your family to let them know of your decision and that you are registered as a donor. Making the decision prior to the time you may become critically ill will ease the burden on your family about making the right decision for you. Once you register, you will receive a drivers license with a red heart on it to indicate to first responders your decision to be a donor. There is no cost to you in being a donor or to your family or estate. It does not impact the medical care you will receive at the end of life. The medical team will do everything possible to save your life.

In order to have your organs qualify for donation, is to protect your own health by maintaining a healthy blood pressure, exercise regularly, eat a healthy diet and have an annual physical.

Through your thoughtful decision to donate, up to 75 people may receive significant benefit making their lives better.

Minutes: The minutes of the June 27, 2022, meeting were reviewed and approved.

Treasurer's Report: June financial reports were reviewed by **Greg Wagner**, approved. Budget for next fiscal year reviewed, still working on a few details.
