

Gene Nutter, has shingles and is miserable at times. Pray for her general health as well



Just off the Highway...

Just off highway 20 in Crawfordville, Georgia is the beautiful, A. H. Stephens State Park. In our travels we were looking for an RV park before we ventured towards the Atlanta area, a major challenge for highway travelers. It was there that we realized that A. H. Stephens was Alexander Hamilton Stephens, the Vice President of the Confederacy. This serene state park around Stephens home and Confederate museum is in the middle of a huge area of Georgia pines.

The park is in three sections part for RV travelers and two parts for Horse trailer/RV's. The area caters to horse riders with numerous trails among the majestic pines. Stephens, a small single man was ill most of his life and wheel chair bound later in life due to an accident. After the Civil War he was arrested by Union Soldiersand charged with treason and was expected to be hung. The town loved their hero (and still does) and they surrounded Stephens home before the arrest, asking for mercy for this "weak" little man. After a few months in prison, he was exonerated by the president and this "weak" man was elected Governor of the state Georgia and died in office. Stephens is buried in



The Recipe Box



Hi Everyone! Still here, still waiting for the weather to warm up above 50* so I can walk in Hessel on the water. But it's cold by the water, and I'm too old to enjoy cold!

Our church was full last Sunday to say "goodbye" to **Pastor Jamey Nichols** and to "welcome" **Pastor Jim Huber**. They both took part in the service. **Jamey** says he'll be preaching in Six Lakes, MI next Sunday.

On to recipes...If you like things made with Puff Pastry, you'll probably like this recipe...

Puff Pastry Breakfast Pizza

- All-purpose flour for dusting
- 1 sheet frozen puff pastry, thawed
- 2 slices bacon
- 1-1/2 cups shredded Havarti cheese
- 3 T shredded parmesan cheese
- 4 large eggs
- kosher salt and freshly ground pepper
- Chopped fresh chives, for topping

Preheat oven to 425* and line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper. On a lightly floured surface, roll out the puff pastry into a 12 inch square, then cut into 4 equal squares. Pinch edges of each square to form 4 rounds. Transfer to the prepared baking sheets and prick all over with a fork. Bake until golden, 8-10 minutes.

Meanwhile cook bacon until crisp, transfer to a paper towel and crumble. Let crusts cool slightly

on the baking sheets. If the centers are very puffy, prick with a fork to deflate. Sprinkle evenly with the havarti and parmesan. Make a shallow well in the cheese in the center of each pizza and crack an egg into the well. Season with the salt and pepper. Top with bacon and return to oven and bake until the egg whites are set, about 10-15 minutes. Top with chives to serve. Serves 4.

I like different flavored butters, and I have made several different flavors. You can serve them on meats like steaks or bagels or vegetables, etc...

Lemon Dill Butter

- 1 stick unsalted butter (room temperature)
- 1 t minced garlic
- 1 t minced, fresh dill
- 1 t grated lemon zest
- 1 T freshly squeezed lemon juice
- 1 t kosher salt & 1/4 t freshly ground pepper

Mix together thoroughly with an electric mixer and keep in a sealed container tn your frig.

I thought this was kind of cute...on the TV show The Walton's, John Boy's future wife who was quite an entitled gal was setting the table for the family and she said "Oh, the plates don't match" and Mary Ellen replied in her usual sarcastic way, "Oh gee, maybe we'll have to cancel dinner!" Although nowadays our plates probably do match, back in the depression, that was the least of their worries!!





To Your Health...

How Much is That?

Now that summer has arrived, many people begin to think about ways to shed a few pounds. Over the years the serving size of food portions has grown, we exercise less and sit in front of our computers more. As a result, it is not surprising people become overweight over time.

This does not mean we can not enjoy the food we like, but we need to eat smaller portions. The calories in the food you eat and drink should be balanced out with the calories burned during exercise, resulting in keeping your weight down.

Your body can help guide you to estimating the proper portion for you.

Your fist, or a baseball, is equal one cup of fruit, pasta, rice or ice cream.

Your thumb from tip to base, or a domino is about equal to one ounce of cheese.

**Your cupped hand is about equal to two
ounces of nuts or pretzels.**

Your palm, or deck of cards, is about equal to three ounces of meat, fish or poultry.

Some other suggestions for you as you decide to lose some weight is to have fruits and vegetables cut up in advance so they are ready for you when you need a quick snack.

Try switching to 1% or skim milk in addition to low-fat cheeses and yogurt. If the taste does not appeal to you, try eating smaller or fewer servings of full-fat.

Fat is necessary in a healthy diet, just in smaller amounts than you previously consumed. Fried foods

can be substituted with grilled or baked versions of the food. Try foods without added butter or margarine or use less of it. Olive oil or canola oil are good substitutes. Eat more low fat meats such as chicken, turkey or ground meat with less fat.

Another idea would be to not add sugar to certain foods like cereal, coffee or tea. You may want to start by decreasing the amount of sugar you add to see if you can still enjoy eating or drinking them.

Be mindful about the amount of salt that is in processed food or that you add to your food. Salt may cause you to retain fluid and add weight. Be sure to read labels and taste food before adding salt.

These are just a few suggestions for you to consider as you start a weight loss program. There are many articles available for you to read and decide what would work best for you and your family. You may want to talk to a dietician if you are still not confident about how to get started.

Getting started on any weight reduction is the biggest challenge. Remember anything new that you try is a step in the right direction.

Minutes of the March meeting were read and approved.

March Treasurers report was reviewed by **Greg Wagner and Deb St. Onge** and report was approved.

Committee Reports:

Pastor's Report: submitted via email by **Pastor Jamey**.

It has been an unforgettable joy to be a part of this ministry for the past several months. Beginning October 2020 and terminating May 22, I am thankful for the privilege, the experiences, the friendships, the challenges, and the many wonderful ways God has woven my life into the life of this congregation. I am forever changed for the better.

On April 14 our Pastoral Search Committee held its final meeting at which time we debriefed our work, thanked God for his provision of a new pastor, and compiled a collection of materials and insights to be preserved for future pastoral search needs.

During my final weeks, I will continue to lead the elders in the care of this congregation and in the last stages of this transition. I will also be working with **Pastor Jim** to ensure a seamless transition as he prepares to settle in.

Youth Group: consistently have 11-15 kids here, continue to be impacted by the school schedules. Will be studying "Biblical manhood and Biblical womanhood". Hope to change youth activities to Wednesday with the next school year. Will continue meet on Thursdays through the summer. Tentative plan to celebrate graduates June 5, will check with the kids.


