The Recipe Box...Sue Rye



Hi, everyone! Has this been a busy summer or what? It has gone by so fast. It's August already!! There was a picture that I loved of Heidi Montague Sloane and her husband in the last issue of *The Spark*. The explanation of who they were did not seem to come through in all copies. The printed copies were okay, but the emailed copies weren't. Anyway, Heidi grew up in Cedarville.

If you have blueberries, this recipe might be for you..

Blueberry Kuchen

1-1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1/4 cup sugar
2 t. baking powder
1-1/2 t grated lemon zest
1-1/2 t. ground nutmeg
1/4 t. salt
2/3 cup 2% milk
1/4 cup butter, melted
1 large egg, beaten, room temperature
1t. vanilla extract
2 cups fresh or frozen blueberries

Topping

3/4 cup sugar

1/2 cup all-purpose flour

1/4 cup butter, melted

In a bowl, combine the first 6 ingredients.

Add milk, butter, egg & vanilla. Beat 2 minutes.

Pour into a greased 9x13 pan.

Sprinkle with the blueberries

In a bowl, combine sugar & flour, add butter.

Toss with a fork until crumbly

and sprinkle over blueberries.

Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes

until lightly browned.

If using frozen blueberries,

do not thaw ahead of time.

The Best Bean Soup

1 large jar of Randall's Great Northern Beans
2 cups diced, cooked ham
4 cups of water
4 diced carrots
1 diced onion
1 cup diced potato
1/2 cup chopped cabbage
1/4 cup diced celery

Put all ingredients in a Dutch oven.
Bring to a boil-then simmer 2 hours.
Then add: 3 t. or 3 cubes chicken bouillon dissolved in 1-1/2 cups boiling water,
1 T. White Vinegar, 1 T. Molasses
Stir well and simmer 1/2 hour more.

This is **Nancy Glupker's** recipe. A lot of us think it's the "best" bean soup. I put this recipe in *The Spark* several years ago, but now it's time for a new generation to make this soup!

Cinnamon Roll Coffeecake

2 cans of cinnamon rolls, quartered
1 can Apple Pie Filling
1/2 cup chopped walnuts or pecans
or a mixture
Mix together in a bowl.
Pour into a sprayed 9 x 13 pan
and bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.

Drizzle with the frosting packets.
