

## Central Methodist Church

## HISTORIC SKETCH

About the turn of the century when what is now the beautiful little city of Denton was nothing more than a cross road, a store, a post office and possibly a small flour mill, people began to look this way believing this to be a place of interest and possibility. This prophecy and hope has long been verified, for long since Denton has become a thriving little city with many advantages and a good place to live to prosper and to enjoy life. As the people began to come to Denton to engage in the various pursuits of life the school and the church were not neglected. An academic school had been established which fell into the hands of Mr. Allen Morris who was a staunch Methodist Protestant. The property had then been purchased by the North Carolina Conference of the Methodist Protestant Church. From surrounding communities a number of Methodist Protestants had located in Denton and began to feel the need of a church of their own. It was the natural thing for them to use the school property for church purposes and it was in this building in the spring of 1902 under the supervision of Rev. J. G. W. Holloway who was then pastor of Davidson charge, that the Denton church was organized. there being nine charter members whose names follow: J. M. Daniel, W. J. Frank, Allen G. Morris, Mrs. Allen G. Morris, J. A. Stone, A. G. Surratt, Mrs. A. G. Surratt, W. F. Wall, Mrs. W. F. Wall. The records show that with this little beginning of nine persons 428 persons have joined the church and that the membership is now 243. The conference records show that during the year 1902 the total budget was \$40.30, a small beginning but it was a start toward larger things and a career of influence and usefulness.

For a number of years the struggling little band had to be content with the school building as a place of worship. But the time came when a beautiful brick building was erected on the corner of Salisbury and Bingham streets. This was opened for services sometime during the year 1913. On November 23, 1915 this new building was completely destroyed by fire, the cause of which has always been a mystery. For two years the school building was again used for all services. In the meantime new grounds were purchased on the corner of Bingham and Second Salisbury streets. This site is a beautiful elevation which has proven to be one of the most beautiful church locations in this locality. Through the untiring efforts of the loyal people the present solid brick edifice was erected. From its elevated location this beautiful church overlooks the city of Denton and invites the people of the town in turn to share its comforts and conveniences as an attractive place for worship. Here is to be found a beautiful, large auditorium and eight good sized, well arranged class rooms. The entire building is equipped with an air system which serves to convey the heat in the winter and the cool air in

When the church was first organized it was placed on Davidson charge where it remained until 1907. At this time Denton church and Pleasant Grove church were set off as a charge known as Denton charge. While at different times a number of churches have been associated with Denton church, there has been a Denton charge since it was established in 1907. Denton and Canaan churches now constitute the charge.

The Denton school has always been a very important factor in the community. It was first a private school, then a church school and now a state school. The church having been organized in the school building and for a number of years having carried on its work in the school building and having all the while been a close neighbor the two institutions have all the while worked hand in hand and shared the great work that has been so helpful to Denton and the surrounding country. This was especially so during the ten or more years Rev. Geo. L. Reynolds was a

resident of Denton and most of that time being both principal of the school and pastor of the church. It was through these two institutions, jointly working together, that he was able to do a most remarkable and outstanding piece of work. "This school helped to prepare a number of the ministers now doing efficient service in the North Carolina Conference."

In 1910 the idea was conceived in the mind of Rev. Geo. L. Reynolds that the Methodist Protestant people of North Carolina might establish and maintain a Children's home at Denton. The good ladies of the conference accepted the idea and at once established this home which after a few years was moved to High Point, N. C. and has been one of the greatest blessings of any work ever carried on by the people of the North Carolina Conference. This institution had its birth within a few hundred yards of the Denton Church and while the institution remained here it and the church were co-laborers in carrying this great work. And since the home has been relocated the Denton Church has continued its most hearty support.

Trogdon, 1921, 2, 3, 4; O. C. Loy, 1925; J. Elwood Carroll and T. Glenn Madison (jointly) 1926; M. C. Henderson, 1927; E. A. Bingham, 1928, 29, 30; J. Robert Short, 1931, 2, 3; T. J. Bowman, 1924, 5, 6, 7; Geo. L. Curry, 1938, 9—.

The church was organized by Rev. J. G. W. Holloway. The first building was erected during the pastorate of Rev. D. A. Braswell. The new location was secured while Rev. W. D. Reed was pastor. The new church was built during the pastorate of Rev. Geo. L. Reynolds. The new church was dedicated in 1926 when Rev. J. Elwood Carroll and Rev. T. Glenn Madison were pastors jointly. During the pastorate of Rev. J. Robt. Short the church was renovated, painted inside and out, walks laid, yard improved and heating system installed. A new lot was purchased on which to build a hut in 1937 while Rev. T. J. Bowman was nastor.

The church was given the name "Central Methodist Church" January 1, 1939.

In the year 1920 the home of Rev. Geo. L. Reynolds was purchased for a parsonage.

Rev. H. Freo Surratt, a member of the North Carolina Conference and successful pastor is a product of the Denton Church. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. H. Surratt are still members of this church.

# Mount Ebal Methodist Church

#### HISTORIC SKETCH

Mount Ebal Methodist Church which is located three miles east of Denton, N. C., is a church which has made for itself a most unusual history. It has been a church of great influence and usefulness.

The location is beautiful and rather unique and in harmony with the Bible name of so much significance. It has considerable elevation with many great granite boulders protruding from the ground while over the ground are giant oaks typical of the primeval forests. The elevation upon which the church is located overlooks a fertile valley and on to another eminence which compares favorably with Gerizim of old.

Among the various activities of Mt. Ebal the camp meetings hold highest importance in the thought of the people who have known this great old church. At one time there was a great arbor and a large number of camp houses or tents. These tents were filled by families from far and near who came to live on the ground for a season every year. The arbor was to accommodate the great crowd of people who gathered to engage in the services of zealous worshipers of that day. A number of these services were conducted each day and many souls found the Lord under this old arbor. Pillars of stone were erected about over the grounds upon which were kept fires of huge pine knots. By this method light was furnished for the camp grounds. The arbor has disappeared and all the tents have been removed, but the stone fire stands are still remaining. And the church is well preserved. There is a tract of land of about four acres upon which is a beautiful cemetery which is well kept. The Denton pastor has supervision and care of the church but there are no longer regular services observed and the membership has been reduced to just a few of the good people who love the old church and are true and loyal.

The losing of the position Mt. Ebal once occupied is to be found in rossibly two causes. In the first place Denton has come into position within a short time and a large number of the influential people who once lived in the vicinity of Mt. Ebal have become citizens of Denton and even a number of the people who remain in the old vicinity have moved their church membership to the Denton church. So, Mt. Ebal is not really dead. It has simply "gone to town." The other cause for the loss of the position this church enjoyed is in the fact that at one time there were five roads that converged at these historic grounds. When road systems were readjusted and in many instances the old horse and buggy roads were converted into automobile roads it so happened that the roads that led to Mt. Ebal were not those of good forture to fall into the new system. And now there is only one little road leading in to the church over which a vehicle can travel.

Records are not available to give the exact date of the organization of this church. But in a well kept record of the quarterly Conference of the Davison charge of the Methodist Protestant Church some very interesting figures are found. On October 26, 1861 in the record of a quarterly conference held at Chapel Hill Church the name of William Sexton appears as one of the members of that quarterly conference. On the same page the name "Sexton's Meeting House" appears and it was to this point the quarterly conference was invited for the next session. Through the years after this the name of William Sexton appears as a member of this quarterly conference and the appointment, sometimes

"Sexton's Meeting House," sometimes "Sexton's School House" and sometimes just "Sexton's." The last time the appointment of "Sexton's' is found is in the records of the second quarterly conference of April 29, 1871. In the third quarterly conference held at High Rock, Aug. 5, 1871 the order was that the fourth quarterly conference be held at Mt. Ebal. From this time on "Sexton's" is not found but "Mt. Ebal" is found regularly. It is reasonable to conclude that the work of Mt. Ebal church had its beginning in a school house which is known to have been located on William Sexton's farm in the year 1861. And in 1871 the work became known as Mt. Ebal. It is reasonably certain that at this time the first church, a log structure was built. Rev. A. J. Laughlin was the pastor. In the year 1883 the old log structure was replaced by the present structure.

These are probably a group of members when the first church was built and are thought of as the charter members, but can hardly be thought of as those who began the work in the old Sexton school house in 1861.

At the beginning of Mt. Ebal's activities it became a part of Davidson charge and remained in this relation until 1919 when it became associated with Denton, which association it still remains.

Two Methodist ministers, Rev. J. D. Cranford and Rev. W. B. Thompson, now successful pastors, have gone out from families of this church.

The First Sunday in June is the regular appointed date for the Mt. Ebal home coming. On this day the Denton Church suspends services and moves back to Mt. Ebal. This is a great all-day gathering when large numbers of people from far and near come to greet each other and engage in inspirational programs as nearly as possible like those of the days of old.

At a recent home coming service the Mount Ebal Memorial Association was formed, having a president, a vice-president, a secretary and a treasurer. Also a board of trustees and the necessary committees to meet needs and requirements. Any friend of Mt. Ebal Church regardless of church affiliations is entitled to membership.
