Mt. Ebal Memorial Marker Erected -

August 27

A Memorial Marker has recently - (8-27-54) been erected at Mt. Ebal Church by the Mt. Ebal Memorial Association.

Mt. Ebal Church was organized in 1861 as "Lextons School House" and was reorganized in 1871 as Mt. Ebal Church, and according to records is one of the oldest Methodist Protestant land marks in this vicinity.

Appearing on the marker is a list of the early members which were obtained after extensive research by the late Geo. L. Curry, ~~a former pastor, and~~ and others.

Rev. Geo. L. Curry was a former pastor of Mt. Ebal Church and organized Mt. Ebal Memorial Association which has done considerably work in preserving the ~~historical~~ property & history of this beautiful land mark.

Although regular services have not been held in this church for a number of years. The Association meets the 1st Sunday in June each year for an all day service -
