Denton's second annual community talent show will be presented this weekend in the school auditorium, with an evening performance scheduled for 7:30 Saturday plus a matinee at 3:00 Sunday afternoon.

Admission will be \$2 for adults and \$1 for children age 12 and under.

"Curtain Time" is the title chosen for this year's show, indicating not only that it will be a night of entertainment, but that proceeds will go into a fund to repair, rejuvenate, and (eventually) replace the stage curtains in Denton School auditorium.

The show will include 17 vocalists (ranging from gospel to Broadway), 11 dancers (everything from clog-

ging to pointe ballet), ninvarious instrumentalists and four variety acts. And Morris will be master o ceremonies.
