#### **October Program Summary**

#### MED-EL: Leading Edge Cochlear Implant Technology

At the October 11 HLAA meeting, Janet Lane, Consumer Engagement Manager, Southwest Region, engaged the audience in a lively discussion of MED-EL cochlear implants. Ms. Lane is a teacher of the deaf and a speech language pathologist. For seven years, Ms. Lane worked in Innsbruck, Austria with Dr. Ingeborg Hochmair, owner and CEO of MED-EL. Dr. Hochmair invented the cochlear implant. MED-EL's mission is "To help people overcome hearing loss as a barrier to communication and quality of life."

There is a candidacy requirement for cochlear implantation. A person generally needs to have severe-to-profound hearing loss and poor speech comprehension scores. Cochlear implant candidates usually have high frequency hearing loss which means they cannot hear consonants. As a result, they cannot understand speech very well. The cost of a cochlear implant to an individual depends on their insurance. Many insurances and Medicare do cover implantation surgery.

MED-EL has the thinnest implant. The surgeon drills a shallow bed in the skull where the implant lies. The implant is flexible. Skulls come in different shapes. MED-EL emphasizes individualization. The surgeon sends an MRI or CT scan of the cochlea to MED-EL. Using its OTOPLAN software, MED-EL measures the length of the cochlea. The surgeon then chooses the correct length of electrode array for complete cochlea coverage.

The electrode array is the cooked spaghetti-like piece of the implant bearing the electrodes which replace the damaged hair cells in the cochlea. Using the soft surgical technique, surgeons insert the electrode array into the cochlea with their hands and a small forceps. After surgery the surgeon sends another image to MED-EL.

With MED-EL's OTOPLAN software, the audiologist can see where each electrode lies and program the patient's audio processor accordingly. MED-EL has FDA approval for hearing preservation, natural sound quality, and music appreciation.

The external cochlear audio processors across the three cochlear implant manufacturers, Advanced Bionics, Cochlear Corp., and MED-EL, are similar. MED-EL has two audio processors. Their single unit on the outside of the head attaches to the magnet on the implant which is under the skin. The other one hangs on the ear like a hearing aid. Both are splash proof. MED-EL has all the accessories - Bluetooth, rechargeable batteries, etc.

UT Southwestern Moncrief Medical Center, Dallas Ear Institute, and Texas Ear Clinic offer all three cochlear implant brands - AB, Cochlear, and MED-EL.

Auditory rehabilitation is the process of actively learning to hear with your implant or hearing aids. All three cochlear implant manufacturers have auditory rehab resources. For MED-EL's resources, contact Janet Lane: 984-227-5687 or janet.lane@medel.com. Research shows that with MED-EL, you do better faster. Medicare will cover six aural rehab sessions with a professional who has Listening and Spoken Language certification. For everyone with hearing loss, routinely and consistently practicing listening skills can improve hearing abilities. Go to *hearinglossfortworth.com*, to the March 2025 newsletter for a list of free resources for independent practice and a QR code of listening skills, websites and apps. Read along with an audio book. Use the captions with YouTube videos. Practice listening with podcasts, music, and whatever other speech listening resources suit you.
