



At E. H. Mott Learning Center, we work to reduce and/or remove barriers that constrain. We help learners break those "chains that bind" so they learn to live their best life!





The elephant is our spirit symbol. It is symbolic of our authority to change our outcomes.



THE LIFE & TIMES OF MRS. EUDEEN HAMER MOTT

She became a beacon of light, truth, and beauty

Eudeen Hamer Mott

was born on December 3, 1947, in Winona, Mississippi She was the 8th of 10 children born to Willie and Classie Louise (Whitehead) Hamer.

Eudeen grew up in Gary, Indiana. She graduated from Gary Roosevelt High School in 1965. Throughout her childhood, Eudeen demonstrated the characteristics that helped everyone around her know that she was destined to do great works. The mere uniqueness of her name complemented the innate knowledge, skills and abilities that would mold her to become a remarkable success - EUDEEN (Emotionally intelligent; Unwavering supporter; Dedicated to excellence; Eager to have influence; Empowering; and "No" was never the right answer).

Eudeen began working early in life. It was important for her to help provide financial support to her family. She worked a variety of jobs here and there, but after about five years of working as a secretary at United States Steel -Gary Works, Eudeen left that "good-paying" job at the steel mill to go to college. as she had a sound idea that she was to become a TEACHER. (No doubt, Eudeen was the oldest college Roilermaker, determined to live out her dream). Eudeen continued her studies at Indiana University where she received a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education (1974) and a Master of Science in Elementary Education (1978).

Eudeen began working as a professional teacher in 1974 Her first assignment was at Edison Middle School in Gary, Indiana (1974 to 1978). She later relocated to Florida and worked in the Broward




her students coworkers, friends, excellence and expected nothing less of others. She had a well-defined, purpose driven life and exercised her right to live her life on her own" term
