

Regular Meeting of the Bremond City Council
City of Bremond
May 20, 2026

The regular meeting of the Bremond City Council was held in the City Hall at 6:30pm, Thursday May 20, 2026, with the following present: Mayor Wilganowski; Councilmember's Kujawa, Cook, Mikolajewski, Boudreaux, Burnett City Secretary Zan, Chief Cook, Public Works Director Kloss, Michelle Bobo, Mike Wilson, Kie Muzyka and Ann Soto.

1. Mayor Wilganowski called the meeting to order at 6:30p.m.
2. Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Statement of Officers- City Secretary Zan administered the Statement of Officers to Mayor Wilganowski, Councilmember Burnett and Councilmember Boudreaux.
4. Oath of Office- City Secretary Zan administered the Oath of Office to Mayor Wilganowski, Councilmember Burnett and Councilmember Boudreaux.
5. Elect Mayor-Pro Tem- Councilmember Cook made a motion to appoint Councilmember Burnett Mayor Pro-Tem. Second by Councilmember Mikolajewski. Vote 4-FOR – 1-ABSTAIN.
6. Public Comments on Non- Agenda Items- Mr. Kie Muzyka addressed the Council regarding the Little Red Rooster parking. Discussion only.
7. Public Comments on Agenda Items- Mr. Kie Muzyka addressed the Council on the July 4 250th Celebration. Discussion only.
8. Councilmember Cook made a motion to approve the workshop meeting of March 19, 2026, Regular City Council Meeting and April 16, 2026, with corrections Item #17. Second, by Councilmember Mikolajewski. Vote unan.
9. Payment of current bills- Councilmember Boudreaux made a motion to approve payment of current City bills totaling \$45,359.33 dollars. Second, by Councilmember Kujawa. Vote unan.
10. Tax A/C Report March- Councilmember Boudreaux made a motion to approve the March 2026 Tax report. Second by Councilmember Cook. Vote unan.
11. Councilmember Boudreaux made a motion to approve Frontier Waste/Solutions rate increase effective July 1, 2026. Second by Councilmember Mikolajewski. Vote unan.
12. Mr. Kie Muzyka 46/Main Street- Mr. Muzyka addressed the Council regarding rerouting truck traffic off Hwy 46/ Main Street and to make San Saba Street the truck route. Mr. Muzyka would talk with TxDOT as well to lower the speed limit on Hwy 46/Mains Street. Discussion only no action taken.

Councilmember Boudreaux made a motion to approve Bremond Chamber of Commerce July 4, 2026, the United States will celebrate its 250th anniversary—or **semi quincentennial**—marking 250 years since the signing of the Declaration of Independence on closing Jack Street, using the Lumber Yard Park, Fireworks, Street Dance and City of Bremond checking with Frost Bite Shaved Ice on providing Sno-Cones. Second by Councilmember Cook. Vote unan.
14. Water Dept. Report - Public Works Director Kloss provided a written report.
 - A. Councilmember Cook made a motion to accept Derrick Tullous letter of resignation. Second by Councilmember Boudreaux. Vote unan.
 - B. Councilmember Burnett made a motion to approve posting Public Works Dept. job opening. Second by Councilmember Boudreaux. Vote unan.
 - C. Councilmember Cook made a motion to approve Public Works Dept. time clock. Second by Councilmember Boudreaux. Vote unan.
 - D. Councilmember Burnett made a motion to approve moving forward with the Texas Water Development Board Grant. Second by Councilmember Kujawa. Vote unan.
15. Utility Clerk Report- Utility Clerk Solley provided a written report
 - A. Councilmember Boudreaux made a motion to charge a monthly water bill to the Bremond Public Library and start giving the monthly \$1250.00 contribution budgeted FY 2025-2026 back to the Library from the City of Bremond. Second by Councilmember Burnett. Vote unan.

 - B. Councilmember Cook made a motion to approve Little Red Rooster \$5000.00 dollar funding proposal. Second by Councilmember Kujawa. Vote unan.
