

Regular Meeting of the Bremond City Council

The regular meeting of the Bremond City Council was held in the City Hall at 6:30pm, Thursday November 15, 2022, with the following present: Mayor Swick, Mayor Pro-Tem Wilganowski; Councilmember's Mikolajewski, Boudreaux, Kujawa, Burnett, City Secretary Zan, Police Chief Pope, Officer Ray, and Erica Gray.

1. Mayor Swick called the meeting to order at 6:32p.m.

If for more than 4 hours, then it needs to be the full agreement with insurance. Seconded by Councilmember Burnett. Vote unan.
