

Regular Meeting of the Bremond City Council

The regular meeting of the Bremond City Council was held in the City Hall at 6:30pm, Thursday November 18, 2021, with the following present: Mayor Pro-Tem Wilganowski; Councilmember's Mikolajewski, Boudreaux, Kujawa, City Secretary Zan, Police Chief Pope, Erica Gray and Kie Muzyka

1. Mayor Pro-Tem Wilganowski called the meeting to order at 6:30p.m.
2. Pledge of Allegiance.
3. Visitors- Mr. Muzyka addressed the Council with concerns on the Dry Bean rebuild. He said he tried to purchase the proposed Library Building and offered \$50,000.00 dollars and they turned it down and the monthly contribution the city gives to the library each month feels it would be better spent on a Police Officer.

16. Councilmember Boudreaux made a motion for the Order of Resolution the City of Bremond 18 votes for Kie Muzyka for Robertson Central Appraisal District Board of Directors 2022-2023 Official Ballot. Seconded by Councilmember Mikolajewski. Vote unan.
17. Councilmember Mikolajewski made a motion to approve the closing of State Hwy 46 on December 14, 2021, four hours or less for the Bremond Chamber of Commerce Christmas Committee Parade. In which case that qualifies as a “Routine Traffic Control” event and only requires notification to us of the closure (what, where, why, hours, PD handling TCP?) in a letter or email. If for more than 4 hours, then it needs to be the full agreement with insurance. Seconded by Councilmember Kujawa. Vote unan.
