



Wearing A Face Mask/Covering Is Required

As of May 14th, wearing a mask in Los Angeles is no longer optional. That day City of Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti issued a new requirement stating that everyone has to wear a face covering when they are outside their own home.

The Mayor said that it is a necessary step to help slow the spread of the coronavirus and eventually reopen the economy in a bigger way. "Bring your mask with you whenever you leave your home," Garcetti said. "That will help us get more freedoms."

WHERE must you wear a face covering? ◆ If you visit any retail business, including those that are open only for curbside or door side pickup. ◆ If you exercise in your neighborhood or are on a trail, golf course or beach (where you must wear a face covering if you are out of the water and people are nearby) ◆ If you ride on L.A. Department of Transportation transit buses, Metro buses or trains, or travel through Los Angeles International Airport.

The new guidelines on face coverings exempt children under 2 and people with certain disabilities.

WHY you should wear a face covering - Face coverings protect wearers from possibly spreading the virus to others, reducing the exhaled aerosols from infectious, but asymptomatic, individuals. Masks can keep the virus from spreading. Additionally, the coverings serve as a really helpful physical barrier when you cough or sneeze, actions can propel this cloud of droplets from you up to 25 or 26 feet. A face covering can "disrupt" that cloud and keep those virus particles from traveling.

As businesses reopen and employees return to work, face coverings can play a pivotal role in helping block the spread of the virus, especially from asymptomatic carriers. The more people in a given space wearing masks, the less viral particles are making it into the space around them, decreasing exposure and risk.

Face coverings can't do it alone though. They should be used in conjunction with social distancing, not as a replacement of that practice.

Your cloth face covering should: ◆ Reach above the nose, below the chin, and completely cover the mouth and nostrils ◆ Fit snugly against the sides of the face ◆ Be made of multiple layers of fabric that you can still breathe through ◆ Be able to be laundered and machine dried without damaging the material or shape.

Please do not buy surgical masks of N95 masks to use as a face covering. These masks are intended for healthcare workers and first responders. Many items you may already have in your home can be used to create face coverings.

People with a disability - Since the COVID-19 pandemic is currently considered a direct threat by the E E O C, a business would likely be on solid ground to require customers to wear face masks or coverings when entering their premises. However, a business would not have the absolute right to refuse to provide a customer service based upon the customer's refusal to wear a face covering. When faced with a customer who is refusing to wear a face mask or covering, businesses should likely limit any questions to the following: Are you unable to wear a mask because of a disability?

If the answer is "Yes," the business should consider moving to engaging the customer in an interactive process to determine possible alternative methods of service that would allow the business to keep its employees and other customers safe, while still providing service/ goods to the customer.

Stubbed Your Toe? Swearing May Help Dull the Pain

Ouch! Many of us swear when we get hurt, and a new study shows it actually does help.

Turns out that swearing can significantly increase your pain tolerance -but only if you use *real* swear words, and not G-rated versions that mimic them, British researchers report.

For the study, 92 volunteers held their hands in an ice bath. To assess their pain threshold, researchers timed how long it took them to begin to feel pain, and their pain tolerance was determined by how long they were able to keep their hands in the freezing water.

Each participant did the experiment four times. In random order, they were instructed to repeat either actual expletives or the fake swear words "twizpipe" and "fouch."

Using actual swear words increased their pain tolerance by 33%, while the fake swear words did little to help people cope. The findings were recently published in the journal *Frontiers in Psychology*.

"This is the first study to assess whether novel 'swear' words have any pain-relieving effects. They didn't, even though they were rated as being funny and emotion arousing," said lead author Richard Stephens, a senior lecturer in psychology at Keele University in the United Kingdom.

"This new finding confirms that it's not the surface properties of swear words, such as how they sound, that underlie the beneficial effects of swearing, but something much deeper, probably linked back to childhood as we learn swear words growing up," he said in a university news release.

Two Lysol Products Can Kill Coronavirus: EPA

The EPA said laboratory tests found that Lysol Disinfectant Spray and Lysol Disinfectant Max Cover Mist destroy the virus two minutes after contact, *CNN* reported.

The agency says there are 420 disinfectant products that are effective against "harder-to-kill" viruses than the new coronavirus, but the two Lysol are products are the first to be tested directly against the virus and able to kill it.

A recent U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention survey found that Americans said they were cleaning more often because of the coronavirus pandemic, but only about half said they actually knew how to clean and disinfect their home safely, *CNN* reported.

Need help paying rent?

COVID-19 has impacted the ability of many people to pay their rent.

If this applies to you, then you may be eligible for a rent subsidy from the Los Angeles City Emergency Renters Assistance Subsidy Program.

From Monday, July 13 at 8 a.m. through Friday, July 17 at 11:59 p.m., the program will provide a grant of up to \$1000 per month to cover the monthly rent, based on what was paid as of March 1 of this year, with a maximum of \$2,000 per household.

The program applies to eligible tenants in the City of Los Angeles who are unable to pay rent due to circumstances related to the COVID-19 pandemic.







