Demonstrating continuing support from residents, Mayor Ginny Dickey filed today to run for re-election as Mayor of Fountain Hills.

Since announcing her bid for re-election on January 17, residents have signed her nomination petitions at the rate of more than 10 per day -- as the Mayor delivered nearly 500 signatures to the Town Clerk, far exceeding the minimum required 297.

"I'm honored to have the support of many residents in this community. I believe we are at a crossroads in Fountain Hills, where choosing future leadership is key to our success because we have many projects underway that deserve our undivided attention." Mayor Dickey continued "We have important choices to make, supporting our efforts in safety and security, addressing our infrastructure needs, and growing our economic base in a way that will provide a sustainable future for the next generation of residents. I'm dedicated to those efforts."

Mayor Dickey has served 2 terms on Town Council, and 3 terms as Mayor. Her experience as a leader of Fountain Hills, and as a leader in regional forums at MAG and the League of Arizona Cities and Towns, and her background in local and state government issues, is vast. Having lived and raised a family in Fountain Hills for more than 40 years, she understands the community and she wants it to remain as the safest community in the region and as a welcoming Town, while remaining focused on addressing the important local issues facing the community.

"As we approach this crossroads, the July 30 election will determine our direction. Let's be thorough, thoughtful, reasoned, and strive to work together for the Town's betterment."
