Grantmaking Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

What types of organizations are eligible for grants?

The Paul Brown Legacy Foundation provides grants to nonprofit organizations that align with our mission to empower communities through love, learning, and legacy. Eligible applicants typically include 501(c)(3) nonprofits, community-based organizations, and educational institutions.

What types of projects does the foundation support?

The foundation prioritizes programs that promote educational opportunity, youth mentorship and leadership, community development, and economic empowerment.

What is the typical grant size?

Grant sizes vary depending on the project and available funding. Most grants typically range from \$2,500 to \$25,000.

How do I apply for a grant?

Organizations interested in funding must complete the Paul Brown Legacy Foundation Grant Application Form and submit all requested information.

When are grant decisions made?

Grant applications are reviewed periodically by foundation leadership. Applicants are typically notified within 30–90 days.

Are individuals eligible to apply for grants?

The foundation generally awards grants to organizations rather than individuals.

Does the foundation accept unsolicited proposals?

Yes. Organizations may submit proposals that align with the foundation's mission and funding priorities.

Are there restrictions on how grant funds may be used?

Grant funds must be used for approved purposes. The foundation does not fund political activities, lobbying efforts, or personal financial assistance.

Does the foundation require grant reporting?

Yes. Organizations receiving funding may be required to submit reports describing the impact of the funded program.
