

Hi Everyone!



Welcome to August!

Jesus said to them (vs 35), ***"I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst."***

What a deal. We are traveling through the 6th chapter of the Gospel according to John for five weeks. I believe that the vaccines to fight Covid will help the world get through this global mess as he got the disciples through the storm (vs 18-20). *They saw Jesus walking on the sea and coming near the boat, and they began to be afraid. But he said to them, "It is I. Do not be afraid."*

Do you remember when Pope Francis led us in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament at the beginning of this pandemic? He invited us to calm our storms. Jesus comforted and spoke to me as I watched it live.

God gave us the gift of science to work through our problems. Greed, pride and divisiveness are even more dangerous viruses than Covid or the delta variant. Jesus Christ is the true Immunity to all viruses and variants. However, he works with us and encourages us to share our knowledge. Did you know we already have the capability to end world hunger, but we don't? Jesus wants to help us.

Last week Jesus fed the 5000 with just five loaves and two fish. After Jesus *gave thanks (eucharist)*, he instructed them to gather together (*synagogue*) the fragments left over. These fragments can heal the world, end all wars, and bring about heaven on earth. Jesus is firm (vs41), ***"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."***

This pandemic along with fire, heat, hurricanes, drought, red tide, flood, famine, disease, crumbling infrastructure, and greed remind us of the ten plagues that eventually catapulted the Hebrew people out of slavery and into the desert for 40 years. They sure knew how to grumble against Moses and God. Although we still grumble, Jesus is still with us and will not give up on us. Sometimes he is only asleep. Our worldly troubles are not going away. We are here on earth to learn how to live in heaven. It is time that we take Jesus seriously and walk with him always and in all ways. Let us trust Jesus to feed us our Daily Bread.

Jesus tells us that he was sent (*apostle*) from God (vs 37-39). ***"Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and I will not reject anyone who comes to me, because I came down from heaven not to do my own will but the will of the one who sent me. And this is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me, but that I should raise it on the last day."***



God has come to bring us HOME!!! Our only duty is to walk with Jesus and welcome all people back to the compassionate love of Jesus through the Eucharist. The Eucharist *is* Jesus who is all loving, merciful and awesome. The Eucharist is heaven on earth. We need to remind ourselves and all others that we are in perilous danger without the Eucharist (the vaccine of heaven).

There are side-affects to being inoculated with Jesus. Don't be afraid. It only means that the Body of Christ is working in your body and blood. LOL!

Well, we survived the tenting of our beautiful, stately and aged church sanctuary. Now we are in the midst of the tenting of our office building built in 1913 by Father Barry. Please keep the prayers coming.

This past Thursday, July 29th, was the Feast Day of Martha, Mary, and Lazarus, some of Jesus's closest friends. Let's take some time to remember the familiar story when Jesus stopped by their house with some companions to visit. First, read the following scripture out loud, calling to mind what happened that day. Now read it again slowly to yourself, putting yourself in the scene. Picture yourself as Mary, Martha, Jesus, Lazarus, or one of the other visitors. Contemplate each person's point of view in the story.

As they continued their journey he entered a village where a woman whose name was Martha welcomed him. She had a sister named Mary [who] sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak. Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me." The Lord said to her in reply, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

Luke 10:38-42

Who did you most easily identify with? Could you imagine the same scene taking place at your own house? What would you do if Jesus and his friends suddenly showed up at your door?

The truth is Jesus shows up at our door every morning. Do we spend our day rushing around, so busy that we forget to slow down and spend time with him? Are we so anxious and worried about things going on in our lives that we don't give him a second thought? In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus tells us spending time with him is "the better part". As hard as it is sometimes, let's do our best to try to have a Mary's heart in a Martha world.


