After the ordination of two deacons at the Cathedral this Saturday, I am grateful to be going on vacation for two weeks. While I am gone, I pray you enjoy Father Jim O'Neal and welcome him "home". He is a retired Army Chaplain and a good friend.

Back in the summer of 1983, I shared with my fiancé that I needed to break it off. The nagging and persistent whisper from God to enter the seminary had to be addressed. Linda, an Air Force pilot, was wonderful, for she truly loved me and knew I needed to answer this call. I was scared.

That priest was Father Jim O'Neal. He then got me in touch with vocation director Father Pat Foley at St. John the Baptist in Atlantic Beach. I began to attend his Bible Studies. It was glorious. For years I struggled and wrestled with the Sacred Scriptures. This enflamed my desire to eventually get my Masters of Art in Sacred Scripture. Thirty years ago this month, I began my first assignment as a priest at St. John the Baptist and I thank God for everyday of my priesthood... in good times and bad times, sickness and health... loved and loving.

Beloved, we are all called by God. We all have a vocation. However, we do indeed need to take the time and listen. We are all "called" to have faith like the woman who encounters Jesus, "*Please, Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters.*"

Thank you for the opportunity to go up to the mountain with Jesus and refresh my soul.

Jubilee Scholarship Winner





Prayer Cards




When my dear, sweet mother, Agnes, went to heaven, she left me the beautiful legacy of my Catholic faith and LOTS of prayer cards. You see my mother was known for her prayers. If anyone in our family or friends came to her with a problem, the first thing she would say was, "Don't worry, I'll pray a novena for you." And she always did!

For much of my life, I had no idea what a novena was. I just knew it must be a powerful prayer. Now I know that a novena is a prayer that is usually prayed for nine days straight for a special petition. I discovered this when my mother came to live with us. Mom would always excuse herself early at night to go to her bedroom to pray. And pray she did. Before I went to bed, I would stop by her room to turn off the light. There she would be sound asleep with her glasses still on and prayer cards strewn across the bed and on the floor. Praying for others was hard work.

There were times when one of her many prayer cards would go missing and she would search everywhere. (No wonder St. Anthony was her favorite!) So, I bought a small, inexpensive 4"x 6" photo album, the kind you can get at Dollar Tree for \$1 for her prayer card collection. Problem solved!

When I eventually inherited her entire collection, I decided to continue her tradition and pray for those in need. I made my own prayer card album filled with some of her novenas, some prayers that I found to be especially beautiful, and the prayers of my favorite saints.

Maybe you, too, would like to start a prayer collection. To get you started, there are small photo albums located in the Adult Formation Center at the entrance of the church. In fact, this week we will begin the novena to St. Monica leading up to her feast day. There will be plenty of cards for everyone.
