FIVE LOAVES AND TWO FISH IS ALL WE HAVE!

Beloved of St. Monica,

We need approximately \$5000 every week to meet all of our bills and serve over 500 members of St. Monica and approximately 50,000 people in Putnam County. The Gospel passage we hear today about the feeding of 5000 is in all four Gospel accounts. It is the center of our faith. What we have is insignificant, what Jesus can do with our little amount, is incomprehensible.

Jesus wants to bless St. Monica Church along the St. Johns River since 1858. After Jesus heard about the murder of John the Baptist, he wanted to be alone with his disciples. When he disembarked the boat and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with compassion. They hungered for healing of mind, body and spirit. And so, Jesus cured them in this deserted place... The crowd had faith in Jesus to perform miracles. Do we?

I remember traveling to the Holy Land in November of 2018 and visiting all the places Jesus walked and taught. It was awesome and overwhelming. One place challenged me deeply. It was where the Gospel brings us today. I sensed I disembarked the boat with Jesus. We told Jesus to dismiss the crowd because they were in a deserted place. If ever we tell Jesus what to do, we ought to be open to his better solution. Jesus simply says, "Give them some food yourselves." They complained, "Five loaves and two fish are all we have."

I have celebrated Mass all over the world these past 30 years. Every time I preside at Mass, I sense Jesus is using me to feed thousands. Spiritual and emotional healing leads to physical healing of hungers. Jesus multiplies the meager loaves and fish people hand us.

We don't have enough to do all the healing and ministry Jesus would like to do here at St. Monica's. And yet we really do. Jesus is in each and every one of us and able to do so much more, but we lack something.


Jesus tells us to bring all that we have. Jesus takes what we bring, says the blessing, breaks us, and gives us to the people who hunger and thirst for holiness. It is through the Eucharist that we feed the poor, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless...through all eternity.

When I was serving in the Navy as a reluctant chaplain 25 years ago, I found myself in Hiroshima, Japan because I needed to minister to three Marines who murdered another Marine. I cried. I wept. I prayed.

This week is the 75th anniversary of the dropping of the atomic bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki (August 6 and 9), let us ask for healing, mercy, love, joy and peace... Let us bring what little peace we have to Jesus. He will multiply our love and mercy beyond our wildest dreams.

“You have made us for yourself, Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you.”





Dear Parishioners,

On the weekend of August 1-2, the annual national collection to support Black and Indian Mission work in our country will be held.

This collection is the oldest national collection for the Catholic Church in the United States – first held in 1884. It supports evangelization efforts throughout our country that serve African-American and Native American Catholic parishes and missions, as well as schools and ministries that serve our brothers and sisters. Even more, the collection supports outreach to non-Catholics in the areas served by the Church in so many communities.

In our own diocese, St. Pius parish, established in 1919 – and its school, established in 1921 – has benefitted from the national collection. Today, St. Pius School is now part of the Guardian Catholic School where it serves 400 students, mostly non-Catholic students, and, like all Catholic schools, has an excellent record for student performance and accomplishment.

Years ago, our own Sisters of St. Joseph who came to our diocese at the invitation of Bishop Augustin Verot in September, 1866 were charged with the education of African-American children. Sisters were even arrested for teaching African-American children. Saint Katherine Drexel, who founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, even funded the establishment of St. Benedict Parish and School in St. Augustine which today is a mission of our Cathedral Parish.

In one of the alternate Eucharistic prayers – we ask that the Father would enable us to be attentive to the pain and anguish – the hopes and fears of others – so that we may walk with them on the ways of the kingdom – a fitting petition for us all now. Even as we all deal with the difficulties and challenges face in daily life because of the COVID 19 pandemic, we have all seen through the media the fact that an undercurrent of racism persists in our country and in the entire world.

I write to ask that you vigorously support the National Collection for Black and Indian Missions more so than ever before – that everyone in our diocese open our hearts at this time with great generosity and love as we all ensure that our Catholic Church remains at the forefront in efforts to address so many needs.

I know that second collections are difficult these days logistically – but I am asking our pastors to work out ways to enable this special second collection to be enormously successful this year.
