# Knowing Jesus

"For this is the will of my Father, that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life." John 6:40

Many people know of Jesus. But how many **truly** know him? How can we come to know Jesus? Jesus is the Word of God. He came to suffer and die to redeem us from our sins. But he also came to live among us and show us the way to his Father. If we want to come to know Jesus, the place to start is in the Gospels. You might be thinking that you already hear the Gospel every Sunday at Mass. That is a great place to start, but it is just a piece of the Gospels. To get the whole picture, try walking with the apostles as they follow Jesus, and listen along with them to what Jesus has to say. Read each of the Gospels from beginning to end and see for yourself.


