"We are called to welcome and assist all to the compassionate love of Jesus through the Eucharist."

Beloved of Saint Monica on this most **joyful** Third Sunday of Advent,

The responsorial psalm today is not a psalm but actually the words of Mary, the mother of Jesus. She bursts into **joy**. She speaks of love. Her words are in response to the greeting (the Ave Maria) of Elizabeth. Mother Mary reflects God's mission statement in which the poor, the hungry, the outcast, and the humble will receive abundant mercy and **joy**. The rich, the well fed, the arrogant and the prideful will all be sent away empty handed when it comes to eternal life.

*"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord;
my spirit rejoices in God my Savior;*

for he has looked upon his lowly servant.

From this day all generations will call me blessed..." Luke 1:46-54

Jesus has a similar mission statement he develops from Isaiah.

He quotes the Prophet Isaiah, but he makes the words his own.

Today these words are fulfilled in your hearing them.

*"The spirit of the Lord God is upon me,
because God has anointed me;
he has sent me to bring **glad tidings** to the poor,
to heal the brokenhearted,
to proclaim liberty to the captives
and release to the prisoners,
to announce a year of favor from the Lord
and a day of vindication by our God."* Isaiah 61:1-11

How has God anointed you?

How does your soul proclaim the greatness of the Beloved?

How does your spirit **rejoice** in God your Savior?

Isaiah speaks as the Bride and Groom of the Anointed One.

God will not clothe us with fig leaves like Adam and Eve to cover their sins, but with a robe of salvation and a mantle of justice. We are clothed in the Body, Blood and Love of Jesus as his Beloved. Look at the woman above the tabernacle. She speaks as the Bride of Christ, the Christ who is coming soon:



*I rejoice heartily in the Lord,
in my God is the joy of my soul;
for he has clothed me with a robe of salvation
and wrapped me in a mantle of justice,
like a bridegroom adorned with a diadem,
like a bride bedecked with her jewels.*

I hope to see some of you at the Reconciliation Service this coming Thursday at 5 pm. We will have 4 to 7 priests. It is a great gift and **joy** to be able to hear Jesus proclaim to us after our humble confession,

*“God the Father of all mercies, through the death
and resurrection of his Son has sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness
of sins and to reconcile the world to Himself. Through the ministry of the Church,
may God grant you pardon and peace. And I forgive you of all your sins in the name
of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen!”*

Please don't try to make a good confession. God uses the Sacrament of Reconciliation as an opportunity to lavish upon us an abundance of blessings, mercy, love, compassion and forgiveness. Maybe we should say the same thing that we say before we receive communion as we approach the sacrament of confession,

“Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof (or soul),
but only say the word and my soul will be healed. Jesus asks us to be
his bride forever and to become One Body.

He encourages us, “Do not be afraid. I love you.”

I pray you hear the following words some time during Advent:
“Your sins are forgiven. Go in **peace**.” And we will respond with great **joy**!

Have you ever thought of going to confession as something like washing your windows? You walk by your windows every day. One day, you look and notice that they need cleaning. As each day goes by, you notice them getting dirtier and dirtier. You keep putting off cleaning them because it is something you don't enjoy doing. Then one day, you finally take the time to clean them. It is amazing! The whole world looks better! You feel so good, you wonder why you didn't clean them sooner.

Confessing your sins doesn't have to seem like a chore. Actually, it is a wonderful opportunity. It gives you time to see how your relationship with God is doing. Are you doing your best to be the person God created you to be? Is there anything in your life that is getting between you and God? Or between you and other people? Realizing you have lost your way is the first step in finding your way back home to God. And saying our sins out loud to another person, especially someone who is standing in the place of God Himself, makes them more real to us—something that needs healing. The spiritual guidance we get in return from the priest is priceless. Finally, hearing the actual words of forgiveness brings peace to our souls.

I was blessed to be with a young man in RCIA after he made his first confession. I asked him what he thought about his experience. His face was glowing and he exclaimed, "I feel like a balloon filled with helium—lighter than air!"

Try looking at confession in a different light. Not a chore to be done, but a wonderful opportunity. You may even find yourself going more often! There will be an Advent Reconciliation Service this Thursday, December 17, at 5:00 p.m. You can also go to confession any Saturday before Mass from 3:30-4:15 or you can call the office at (386)325-9777 and make an appointment.




