But mostly, I miss his voice at the Eucharist at special occasions. Bishop John was the best spiritual father I could ever ask for. Please join me in thanking God for 40 years of beloved Bishop Jack as we embrace 150 years as the Diocese of St. Augustine.

Reconciliation

When was the last time you cleaned your windows? Is it something that you put off doing? But when you finally get around to washing them, aren't you amazed by how clearly you can see the beauty outside?

Don't you wonder why you didn't do it sooner?

Going to confession can be a bit like that for a lot of people. You know you should go, but you just can't find the right time to do it. Then there is the problem of what you are going to say and how you are going to say it. No matter what you say, it is embarrassing! Sin is embarrassing. But everyone does it. We let God down. We let others down. We let ourselves down. So what do we do? We apologize and say I'm sorry. God is a patient listener. He loves us more than we'll ever know. He can't wait for us to turn to Him and ask forgiveness, so He can shower us with His grace and we can be in harmony with Him again. Some ask why we must confess our sins to a priest. Why can't we just talk to God? The Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation gives us the opportunity to take a close look at how we are living our lives. We say our sins out loud.
