Prayer-Formal Prayer

Do you ever find yourself having trouble praying when you are tired, sick, depressed, stressed, or grieving?

Do you ever find yourself searching for the words to use to express yourself to God in prayer?

Formal prayers may be just what you need in moments like these. Formal prayers are often prayers that were written by someone else, who we feel were able to express the things **we** want to say to God. They are usually inspirational and beautifully written. We choose to pray them because they touch our hearts and draw us nearer to God.

Some formal prayers can be found in scripture. The Psalms, for example, are 150 sacred songs inspired by God and written mostly by King David. In the gospels, Jesus himself taught the apostles how to pray with the Our Father prayer. Also found in the gospels is the Magnificat, which is word for word Mary's own prayer of praise to God.

The saints are also a wonderful source of formal prayers. Their prayers often give us insight into their relationships with God. The Anima Christi, the beautiful prayer that we pray together after receiving Communion, is often attributed to St Ignatius of Loyola. St. Augustine, the son of our own St. Monica, wrote the Holy Spirit Prayer, as well as other prayers which have given inspiration to many. Probably one of most popular and famous saint's prayer is the Prayer of St. Francis, which has even been set to music.

There are countless formal prayers that have either been passed down to us throughout history or written during contemporary times. It is up to you to discover the ones that help you grow closer to God. They can be found on prayer cards or in prayer books in religious stores, searched for on the Internet, or located in apps on your phone.

An app that you can get free of charge that is filled with many Catholic resources is Laudate.

Its **Prayers** section is filled with many formal prayers for you to choose from.


