

Beloved of St. Monica,

My heart is exploding with gratitude and love.

It is Father's Day and our Diocese celebrating 150 years, and our Bishop Felipe celebrating 50 years as "Father", has ordained six more men who now are called "Father" for the first time:

Father Maurice Culver, assigned to St. Catherine of Sienna, Orange Park

Father Jared De Leo, assigned to St. Anastasia, St. Augustine

Father Anthony Hamaty, assigned to Queen of Peace in Gainesville

Father Chris Knight, assigned to Holy Family, Jacksonville

Father Clay Ludwig, assigned to St. Joseph until Sept and back to Rome for studies

Father Mason Wiggins, assigned to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, Palm Coast

Last year, Bishop Felipe ordained four wonderful men: Father Eric, Father John, Father Rob, & Father Nick. When our Diocese was established in 1870, Bishop Verot covered the entire state of Florida except Pensacola, but he only had 3 priests.

Father Maurice (Mo) served with me in the U.S. Navy as a doctor at the Hospital, NAS JAX. Now he will serve with me as a spiritual doctor with the title "Father Maurice".

Father Clay Ludwig is the son of Carl and Susie Ludwig. His father sponsored me on the Cursillo when I was still in the Coast Guard. Our prayer group is still strong and has produced Father Jeff, Father Ron... and now Father Clay (son of Carl).

Father Jarrod often spoke with me when I filled in at Queen of Peace. To watch him transform into a shepherd of Jesus is heart warming.

Last week was glorious. The brothers Jesus and Andrew completed their journey to full Communion in the Catholic Church with Confirmation and First Eucharist. Eleven of the 12 RCIA candidates and Catechumens have been welcomed as full members of our church.

We were wowed by Nolan, Christian, Ryan & Oscar who received First Communion after all their hard work with Catherine Webb and the team. During the retreat, they got to go to Reconciliation for the second time. Their penance was to ring our 121 year old church bell! They also simulated what it would have been to be baptized with a lot of water and have their mothers dry them off. The joy was contagious.



Diocesan Priests Who Became Bishops

Eleven bishops have come from the Diocese of St. Augustine. The modern-day ones you know:

Thanh Thai Nguyen, auxiliary bishop of the Diocese of Orange, Calif., fled Vietnam with his family in 1979. After his ordination, he came to Jacksonville to serve the large Vietnamese population. He was pastor of Christ and St. Joseph parishes.

Robert Baker, bishop of Birmingham, Ala., was ordained a priest in 1970 by Bishop Paul Tanner. He served throughout the diocese, including as rector of the Cathedral Basilica of St. Augustine. In 1999, he was named bishop of Charleston and, in 2007, was appointed bishop of Birmingham. The Holy Father accepted his resignation due to retirement on March 25, 2020.

William Larkin, the late bishop of the Diocese of St. Petersburg, Fla., was ordained a priest in St. Augustine in 1947. In 1979, his old seminary roommate, Pope John Paul II, named him bishop of the Diocese of St. Petersburg. He died in 2006.

Bishop William Kenny, Bishop Michael Curley and Bishop Patrick Barry also were diocesan priests when they became bishop of the Diocese of St. Augustine. Curley and Barry were originally from Ireland. Kenny was from New York. Bishop Curley became archbishop of Baltimore in 1921, and in 1939, he was named archbishop of the newly created Archdiocese of Washington.

But there are others you might not know about.

In the 19th century, two Minorcan cousins – Dominic Manucy and Anthony Pellicer – descendants of a pioneer family in St. Augustine were ordained priests and became bishops.

Bishop Manucy was named vicar apostolic of the newly established Vicariate of Brownsville, Texas, in 1875, and in 1884 was appointed Bishop of Mobile. He died in 1885.

Bishop Pellicer was named bishop in 1874 of the Diocese of San Antonio, Texas, where he served until he died in 1880.

In 1910, Bishop Kenny consecrated one of his priests, Maurice Patrick Foley, who was appointed bishop of Tuguegarao, Philippines. In 1916, Bishop Foley was named bishop of Jaro, Philippines, but died three years later of fever.

John Joseph Fitzpatrick, ordained in the diocese of Buffalo in 1942, moved to the St. Augustine diocese in 1948. When the Diocese of Miami was established in 1958, he transferred to the new diocese. In 1968 he was named auxiliary bishop of Miami and in 1971 was appointed bishop of Brownsville. He died in 2006.




