From a Parable of Jesus the Christ

Here we are on the last week of Ordinary Time. I pray it is a time for healing. As the Liturgical year comes to an end with the Feast of Christ the King next week, let us reflect on how we are sharing our gifts, including our citizenship, with God. After all, God owns everything, even our breath.

Each one of us is asked by God to evaluate how we reach out to the people with less gifts or talents. God asks us to accept our own part in the divisions that have wreaked havoc on our nation... and our world.

I hope this prayer post from the Washington National Cathedral from the Episcopal Bishop Mariann Edgar Budde and Dean Randy Hollerith:

The votes have been cast, the vast majority have been counted and the people of America have spoken. It now appears clear that Joe Biden will become the nation’s 46th president, and we will begin anew the work of repairing the frayed fabric of our common life.

To President-elect Biden and Vice President-elect Harris, we offer our prayers for wisdom, grace and the certain knowledge of God’s presence in the difficult work ahead. To President Trump and Vice President Pence, we give our thanks for their service to our nation, and prayers for God’s guidance as they lay down the powers of their office.

That we are a bruised and divided nation is not news. Yet only together can we meet the enormous challenges before us. All Americans, and particularly our leaders, must put the healing of the nation above partisan loyalties.

As Christians, we believe that we are not alone in this endeavor. St. Paul reminds us that we will see God among us when we exhibit what he called the evidence of the Holy Spirit: “Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.” (Galatians 5:22-23)

As Americans, as we encounter those who may have cast different ballots, may we seek an extra measure of grace and compassion. Neither partisan triumphalism nor ideological defeatism will aid us in the hard work ahead.

This is a time to draw upon what President Lincoln described as “the better angels of our nature,” and to take to heart the words he spoke in his Second Inaugural Address: “With malice toward none, with charity for all, with firmness in the right as God gives us to see the right, let us strive on to finish the work we are in, to bind up the nation’s wounds.”

We pray for this nation and for our leaders. We pray for patience and endurance. We pray that as we move forward, no one is left behind. We pray that in all we do, may we be guided by the prophet’s call to do justice, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with our God.

O God, you made us in your own image and redeemed us through Jesus your Son: Look with compassion on the whole human family; take away the arrogance and hatred which infect our hearts; break down the walls that separate us; unite us in bonds of love; and work through our struggle and confusion to accomplish your purposes on earth; that, in your good time, all nations and races may serve you in harmony around your heavenly throne; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

For the past month, my little horse, Dandy, has had a terrible eye infection. We treated his eye with different antibiotics, but the infection continued to spread and he was in a lot of pain. We took him to the horse hospital at UF and were told he would need to stay another six weeks and receive even more treatments and his pain and suffering would continue. In the end, he would not regain his vision. The best answer was to remove his eye and they did. The vet said he was almost immediately relieved of his pain. The infection was gone. His quality of life was immediately improved.

This experience reminded me of Matthew 5:29. “If your eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one of your members than to have your whole body go to Gehenna.” Of course, Jesus did not mean you should pluck your eye out. But he did mean that whatever is causing the sin in your life should be plucked out. If you have a friend who is a bad influence in your life, find new friends instead who bring out the best in you. If spending countless hours on social media or TV is keeping you from time with your family, give it up or set some limits. Just like it would be best to give up excessive drinking if it is ruining your relationships. Making changes in our lives takes determination and the fruit of self-control.

We are given the gift of free will. It is a tribute to God when we exert our self-control and choose Him and His ways instead of the ways of the world. In the end, the decision is ours to make, but the power to do it comes from God. It is the most essential fruit of the Holy Spirit and a key to our salvation.

“For the grace of God that brings salvation has appeared to all men. It teaches us to say “No” to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age.” (Titus 2:11-12)






