Joe Grasso and I served on a KAIROS weekend recently. It was a truly awesome experience of God's infinite love. However, it was a gift that keeps on giving. This weekend is never ending. We continue to come together in prayer. We teach those who have been judged by the world to love and forgive. We teach them to fish. Jesus challenges us on a regular basis. ***"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, a stranger and you welcomed me, naked and you clothed me, ill and you cared for me, in prison and you visited me."*** Not only were we honored to visit, pray and eat with the prisoners... but they became our friends in Christ. This was one of the most powerful weekends of my life. It seems to be a continuation of the Cursillo weekend I experienced in 1983, before I even entered the seminary. It was on that original weekend that I met Bishop Jack Snyder for the first time. It is when I committed myself to this beautiful diocese of Saint Augustine.


The weekend was God's time (Kairos time). The team of 40 men of all races, denominations and various levels of freedom... came together with 30 participants who became united in the love of Christ for us and for each other. We were enflamed by the Holy Spirit. We keep saying throughout the weekend, "Listen! Listen! Love! Love!" And that is what we did.

Last Friday and then Saturday, Joe and I went back to the prison for the Catholic Service and then the reunion of the weekend for more support. Lives of the prisoners had been transformed by the healing touch of Jesus. I know many will be skeptical, but the recidivism rate for prisoners in the state of Florida is 10 times lower for those who take part in the KAIROS weekend and continued small Christian faith groupings.

Every talk given begins with the following prayer spoken by every person in the room:

*Jesus, come join us
in our journey
as we seek Your will for
this community in this
environment.*

*Teach us to love each other
as You love us,
to give ourselves
as You give Yourself,
so that the Kingdom of God
might be made present to all.
Amen*



Jesus began his Ministry by saying, ***"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. God sent me to proclaim liberty to captives, recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."***

Please look around at the many opportunities to share in the mission of Jesus. We have an awesome Food Pantry always looking for volunteers. Jesus is looking for laborers like ministers of adult faith formation, catechists, music, servers, proclaimers of the Word, environment, technology experts, prayer warriors, respect life, child care, bulletin, finance counsel, parish counsel, volunteers, and bereavement. Please pray about how God is calling you to this great adventure of Mission. I sense Saint Monica is simply a field hospital. We tend to the wounds of the soul. God is our spiritual and soulful surgeon.

Please pray for me as I enter into this Certificate of Catholic Social Teaching at Catholic University in Washington D.C.

Sometimes, when we enter our church, we forget where we are. We get caught up by the excitement of seeing our friends, remembering things we need to tell people, or looking around to see who all are worshipping with us. It is easy to forget whose house we are in.

Our church is the home of our living Lord, Jesus Christ. He is physically present in the tabernacle in the form of the Eucharist. He is inviting us to dinner, which is what the Mass is about. Our first thought upon arriving should be to greet our Host. We should acknowledge his presence in silence and greet him with the honor and reverence due to our creator and redeemer.

We should glorify and worship him with words straight from our hearts. We should thank him for the many blessings he has bestowed on us during the past week. And in humility, we should also beg his forgiveness for not always being our best selves.

If you like to arrive early, you have the wonderful opportunity to do even more. Sometimes, there will be soft music playing. Let it seep into your soul and quiet your mind. Close your eyes and let God speak to you. If there is time, greet our blessed Mother with a rosary prayed in her honor for your special intentions. Or look over the readings ahead of time and think about what they mean and what God is asking of you in your life.


