GOD'S NAME IS JESUS

"The Word was God / all things were made through Him / The Word became flesh and lived among us." (John 1:1/2/14)

A little girl told her mother she was going to draw a picture of God. When her mother said nobody knows what God looks like, she said, "I know mommy, that's why I am drawing Him."

God, who is uncreated and invisible, who simply willed this Universe into existence, is the ultimate mystery. "No one has ever seen Him at any time" (John 1). We cannot imagine who or what He is.

We can see Him in Jesus. The "Word"; that part of God we human beings can relate to, who made our universe, became a "flesh and blood" human being. Here we see clearly that He loves us and will forgive us.

Deity He has come to us. He created (Genesis 12) and reached out to the Jewish people through words, dreams, acts, etc. for 1400 years and led them to record it in the Old Testament (Hebrews 1:1-3).
