THE MIRACLE MILE

Blessed are the Humble People

"Blessed (happy, joyful, to be envied) are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 5:3)

In Matthew 5-7 and Luke 6, Jesus finds a level place up in the mountains, and teaches the kind of life He wants us to live. These are our goals, not our attainments. Like Paul, we say, "Forgetting what is behind, and reaching forward to what lies ahead, I pursue my goal" (Philippians 3:13-15). We fail every day at some point, but we get up and keep going.

Jesus' message begins and ends with promises. It begins, telling us if we live for Him we will be **blessed** (5:1-10) and it ends telling us our life will be built on a rock that enables us to face life's storms without losing our joy (7:24).
