Joseph the Forgotten One

Joseph is the forgotten one at Christmas. The Bible mentions no animals in the barn but they get more press than him. He is one of the strongest, bravest men in the Bible. He believed God's message about the virgin conception. He obeyed God, even though neighbors looked upon him as immoral for getting Mary pregnant or the immoral man who got Mary pregnant or the fool who married an immoral girl. Dr. Herschel Hobbs says:

“He identified himself with her condition. He bore her shame as his own. The neighbors would gossip. The stigma of fornication would fasten its stinging fangs in Mary's heart. But it would strike him also. Under the lash of public scorn, Mary's tender flesh would quiver; but as always, between her and the lash, stood Joseph.”

In Nazareth, he was a faithful husband to Mary; step-father to Jesus and a father to the six children he had with Mary. He showed courage and the willingness to make sacrifices when he took his little family to live in Egypt. He was as a good man and his goodness reached the place too many of us leave it behind - in his home.
