The Gospel of Mark

THE CALL TO WITNESS

"Come follow Me and I will make you fishers of men." - Mark 1:16-20/
Matthew 3:18-22 / Luke 5:1-11

Jesus needed more than friends to walk with Him; He needed servants to work for Him. He came to provide forgiveness for all people, and it is our task to tell as many people as we can about it, so they can be in heaven with us. As Jesus put it, we need to "fish" – throw out our lines and catch men, women, boys and girls. We are to share what Jesus has done for us with others. The woman in Samaria did that. She told her neighbors; they came to listen to Jesus and many found salvation (John 4).

A missionary doctor restored a young boy's sight and a week later, the boy came back holding a rope with ten blind people from his village holding it also.

We can witness by **faithfulness to God's church.** When Sherman marched through

Georgia, an elderly lady tried to chase him out of her town with a broom. He laughed and asked her if she thought she could stop him with a broom. She said, "No I don't, but I want everyone here to know which side I am on."

We can *invite people to come to church*. After Philip met Jesus, he told his friend Nathaniel about Him, but Nathaniel had his doubts. Philip didn't argue, he just told him to come and see for himself (John 1:43-45).

To do this, we must *live clean lives*; free from the sins practiced all around us. Paul told people who preached against stealing and led dishonest lives that, "The name of God is blasphemed because of you" (Romans 2). We still do wrong at times, but people must see we are in earnest in our efforts to live right.

We need to *love others;* which means we treat them the way we want to be treated and are willing to help them no matter who they are (Luke 10:25-37). A new pastor visited the community and when he asked one man if he was a Christian, the man replied, "Ask my neighbors."

And the most important thing; is to let everyone know that any good they see in us, comes from our relationship with Jesus. John Wesley heard the town bell ringing, announcing that some criminal was being hanged. His eyes filled with tears and a friend asked him if he knew the man. Wesley said, "No. I was just thinking that if Jesus had not come into my life, that bell could be ringing for me."
