NOT BEING BLIND

"if we say we have no sin (singular- our sin nature) we are fooling ourselves and if we say we have not sinned (plural - acts of sin) the truth is not in us. {1 John 1)

"The desires of the flesh are opposed to the

desires of the spirit. They are constantly in conflict with each other." [Gal. 5]

_The word "Sin" singular points to our old evil nature that God leaves in us, the kind of person we were before we came to Christ. The Bible calls it the "flesh".
