giving this to you, trusting you to show me what to do.

At the heart of the life of prayer is regular "alone time" with God and our Bible. In about 15 minutes, we can get alone and visualize ourself being in the holy presence of God. We read a short Bible passage and talk with Him about what we read or what is going on in our lives.

Our best example is Jesus. (Luke 4) When Satan tempted him three times, he answered him with three quotes from his Bible. Did you notice he talked to Satan out loud, just as he did with Simon Peter when he, said, "Get behind me Satan." Adrian Rogers says:

"Talking to the devil Is not praying to the devil. You don't pray to a cat when you tell it tothe scat."

Ephesians 6 says the Bible is our sword. All through the day, we apply what we learn to the situations we face, good and bad, as I did with challenges to my church. Spurgeon says, "We do not walk around all day, sword in hand. The sword is in the scabbard, ready to be drawn in a moment."

ECSTASY- GOD'S "YES" ANSWER

We can't prove it and we don't have to, because we know it in our hearts. And when life is hard, we can always go back to those holy moments and know God is listening even when it seems like He isn't.

"Test your memory. What were you worrying about one year ago today?"

Pastor W.A. Criswell's plane was going down into the jungle that would swallow it up and make it invisible to rescuers, He said he put his face in his hands and prayed he would die in the crash.

The pilot said, "There is a creek and a village. Dr. Criswell said it looked like a thread lying next to a penny.

God guided that little plane and it landed safely in a narrow creek. Somewhere in my library I have a picture of Dr. W.A. Criswell, riding "piggy-back" on the back of a native, to safety.

After the rescue Dr. Criswell said they held a prayer and praise meeting and he led the singing. I heard him say, from his pulpit, in the First Baptist Church of Dallas, Texas, that for the first time in his life, he *really* sang the third stanza of "Amazing Grace"

"Through many dangers, toils and snares
I have already come
Tis grace has kept me safe thus far
And grace will lead me home."
