PROPOSED AMENDMENT:



Lodge Members,

The following bylaw amendment has been proposed for our lodge:

Proposed Amendment to Article X, Section 2(b) of the Bylaws of Faribault, MN Lodge No. 1166 of the BENEVO-LENT AND PROTECTIVE ORDER OF ELKS of the United States of America.

Article X, Section 2(b) shall be amended to read:

All Lodge dues hereafter specified shall be payable: annually, in advance, on or before April 1st of each year.

The regular Lodge dues shall be \$40.50 per year, which shall not include the Grand Lodge per capita fee, the Grand Lodge per capita insurance assessment, and State Association dues.

This amendment was read at the regular Lodge Meeting on December 21, 2023. It will be voted on at the regular Lodge Meeting on January 18, 2024 at 7:30 PM. In order to be enacted, the amendment must be approved by a majority of the members present at the meeting.

THE HEART OF ELKDOM GAME RULES:

Join us on Saturdays at 6:15 pm for the HEART OF ELKDOM drawing for your chance to win Elks MOOLAH. Here's how it works: To begin, 52 playing cards including one are placed faced down on the board and numbered 1-52. One of the playing cards will display the HEART OF ELKDOM. If your ticket is drawn, you select a card. The winner shall select one face down playing card; if that playing card is the HEART OF ELKDOM, you win the MOO-LAH.
