CLOUDY WITH A CHANCE OF SAILING...

This session we welcomed Mission de Faith churches back for their 2nd summer here at JMSC! We were also so happy to welcome new and returning sailors to this session. Throughout our session, we were able to learn about how sailors use wind and natural elements to benefit them. These formed our 8 STEM lessons which involved learning about natural process including how wind forms, wind and pressure zones, buoyancy, water quality, and sustainability, and creating scientific equipment to test these topics.

"The past two weeks were perfect for kicking off our first session. The first week gave us some light winds, which allowed for a perfect introduction into sailing. Kids learned parts of the boat and points of sail and caught on to the concepts very quickly. By the second week a few of them were able to sail upwind, which is a tricky skill to learn with the shifty Barlow Lake winds. The kids also enjoyed getting experience at the helm and sailing around the figure 8 courses. We had one windy day that cut short our sailing time but, we were able to work on our seamanship skills instead! Sailing with the Misión de Fe kids was a great time and I'm proud of all they learned and accomplished!"


