Prerequisites (if any):

- ~ Must be a strong reader, able to read between 120 - 140 wpm at minimum
- ~ Must be a good typer, able to type between 18 - 20 wpm
- ~ Must be a good writer, able to write approximately 10 wpm. (Grammar & Penmanship is not important)
- ~ Must be able to complete homework in order to anchor.
- ~ Must bring a laptop or iPad to class most weeks.

Class Description: Welcome to the world of **NEWS ANCHORING!** This course includes broadcasting, news anchoring, live television production, reporting, and news writing. Students will also be creating a monthly digital co-op newsletter where they will be conducting teacher, parent, and student interviews. During our News Anchoring weeks, we will cover HCU Co-Op news, global & local events, sports, and meteorology.

Students will rotate working positions such as news anchor, weatherman, teleprompter, cameraman, director, journalist, and broadcast technician.

Students will learn how to utilize design creators such as Canva to help design commercials and our newsletter.

This class requires 2 Field Days where we go out to the field to conduct our journalism interviews & reporting. We are also attempting to organize a field trip to a local news station as the CNN Atlanta tours have been canceled. Students will have weekly homework to prepare for class each week.
