She also contributed a powerful mural design for the City Walls Project, "Transforming Neighborhood Alleys with Art." Her piece for Manistique Alley centers on themes of wellness and mental health, featuring a meditative figure submerged in a dreamlike underwater world—symbolizing perseverance, hope, and healing. In addition, Andrea recently completed a concept sketch for what may become her most ambitious mural to date, inspired by the Eastern European Folk Lore Slavic goddess Marzanna. This deeply symbolic work explores resilience, cultural identity, and rebirth, paying tribute to the strength of women—especially those in Detroit's diverse communities. Both pieces showcase Andrea's passion for meaningful public art that invites reflection and connection.
